Can I use commas in a list correctly?

Commas should be used:

1. To separate items or adjectives in a list.

For example:

His favourites puddings were apple pie, rhubarb crumble and ice cream.

Monika wore a red, blue, purple and white jumper.



Note that a comma is not normally used before the final 'and' in a list.

It is, however, acceptable to use a comma before the final 'and' if the last two items in a list could cause confusion.

For example:

His favourite puddings were apple pie, rhubarb crumble, and jelly and ice cream.

The use of a comma before the final 'and' indicates that 'jelly and ice cream' is considered a single item.
