Can I use commas in direct speech correctly?

Commas should be used:

5. To separate direct speech from the rest of a sentence

For example:

"It's time to leave for school," called Mum.

"Stop right there," the man commanded.

"It's time to go to bed," said Dad.

Ben cried, "I didn't do it!"
Amy called out, "I know the answer!"
The monster liked his lips, "I'm hungry!" he roared.

Which bit of the sentence is said out loud?

Commas should be used:

A comma is not always needed in direct speech if another punctuation mark is used to separate the speech from the rest of the sentence.

For example:

"Give me the money!" he snarled.
"Where have you been?" asked Dad.

NOT

"Give me the money!," he snarled.
"Where have you been?," asked Dad.
