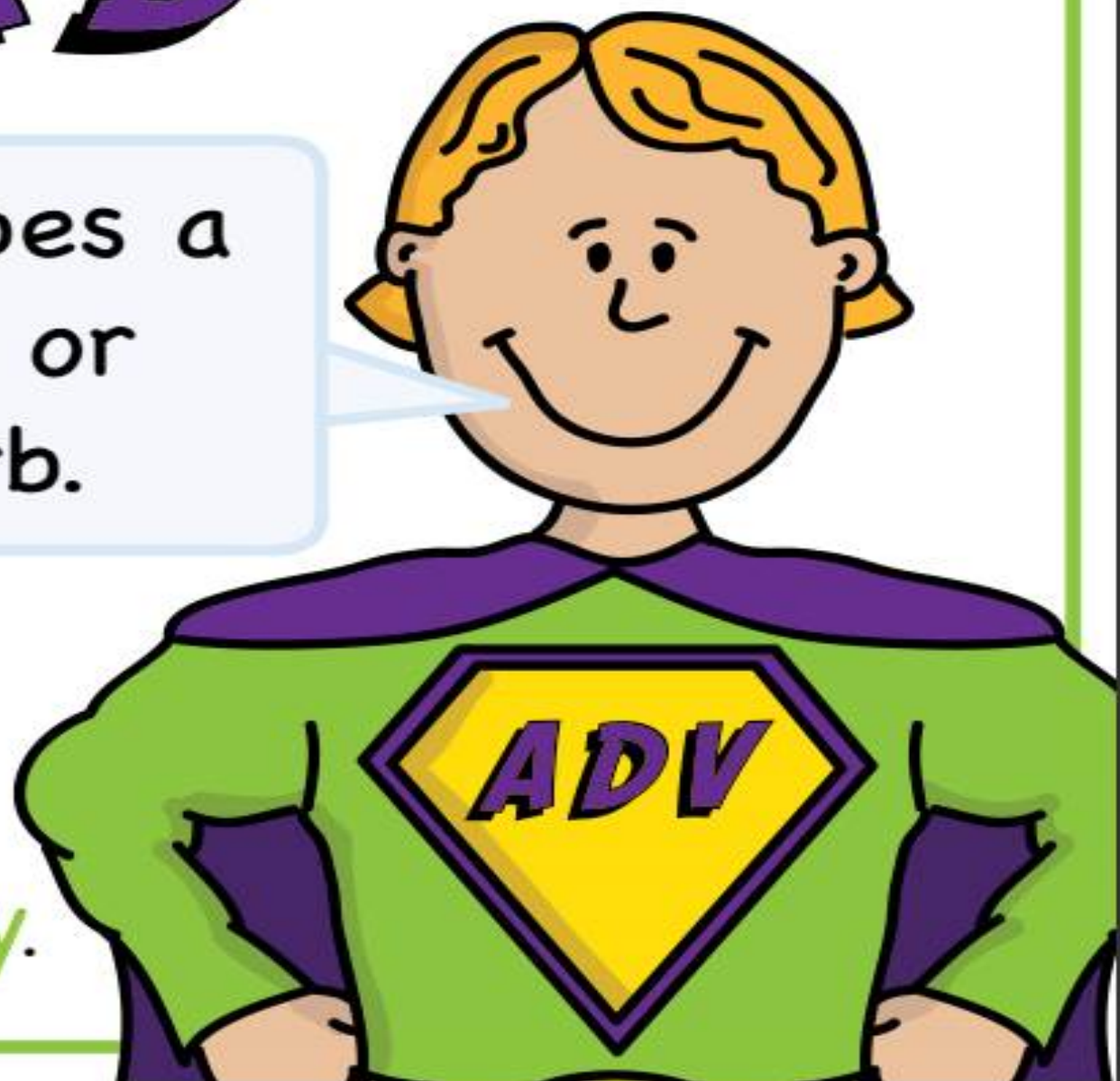
Can I use adverbs for how, where and when?

ADVERB

An **adverb** describes a verb, adjective or another adverb.

They talked **loudly**.

She danced **beautifully**.



Adverbs tell you
How, When or
Where something
happens

ADVERBS		
Describes verbs		
HOW	WHEN	WHERE
quietly	after	inside
loudly	before	outside
softly	now	here
slowly	later	everywhere
quickly	never	somewhere
carefully	today	downstairs
really	tomorrow	upstairs

Teacher Example:
I looked at the picture and wrote
adverbs sentences about it.



1. How - Bee shouted **loudly** for help.
2. Where – Bee shouted for help **under the tree**.
3. When – **After a while**, Bee shouted for help.

Notice: Not all adverbs end in –ly.

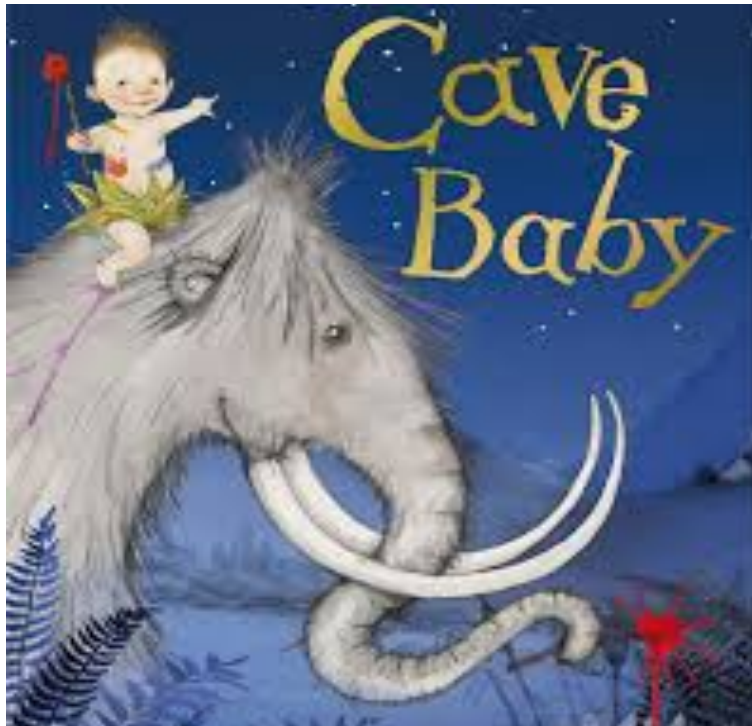
