Is he correct? Explain your answer.



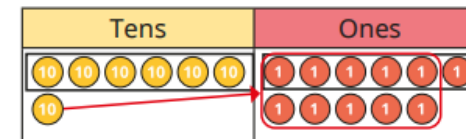
