

English

This half term we will complete our work on fables, writing our own. Before then focusing on reading and writing using football as a writing stimulus. Using the author Tom Palmer and his character Rocky Race.

This half term will complete our work on fables. We have already learned the Hare and the Tortoise fable and read a variety of other stories. Our outcome will be to plan and write our own fable based on the hare and the tortoise using our own characters. We will focus on using adverbials and inverted commas to mark speech correctly.

As mentioned above, using football as a writing stimulus. We will focus on the short World Book Day follow up story, The Soccer Diaries – Rocky takes the lead by the author Tom Palmer. This is a story all about his character Rocky Race and her journey towards becoming a footballer. We will write our own football diaries and produce a match report on the final big match.





U3.5.1.	Make links between the Scripture sources (Lk 24:13-35 and Matt 28:16-20) and what happens at Mass.	
U3.5.2.	Use religious language to describe the Christian belief in the mystery of God as Trinity and describe some signs and symbols of the Holy Trinity (e.g., Jesus called the disciples to 'make disciples of all nations' in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Christians make the sign of the cross as a prayerful reminder of their baptism through the Holy Spirit to be children of God and participants in the Christian community).
