Industrial Action – 15th and 16th March

Industrial action is planned to take place in school on Wednesday 15th and Thursday 16th March.

As with previous recent strike days, St Martins will remain open to our community of vulnerable young people, however, the school day will look different as the number of teaching staff working may be limited. In the recent strike days, student groups have been merged, and we collapsed the usual timetable and curriculum offer. The two day strike is likely to play out in the same way. Managing and maintaining safeguarding and the health and safety of students and staff will be our main priority.

We understand that some of our young people will find the changes to their school routine challenging and so you may prefer to keep your young person at home for the day(s) – absences will be authorised.
