Weekly Update: 25/10/24

Students impressed the Inspectors with their positive attitudes and the respect and kindness that they show for each other. We are so proud of our students and the journeys that they are on and progress that they make.

Safeguarding Update

Our Safeguarding Team are here to support you and your young people as they navigate through life. The online world is forever evolving and it's so important we educate ourselves as Parent Carers to help keep our young people safe.

Here are five top tips to help keep your family safe online:

- 1. **Open Communication** Encourage and have regular conversations about online experiences this can help with any uncomfortable conversations that may need to be had at another time.
- 2. **Set Clear Rules** This could be things like time limits and a list of appropriate websites. Ensuring communication is respectful and discussing the consequences of negative behaviour online. Think before you share.





- 3. Risk Teach your child about online dangers such as cyberbullying, inappropriate content and stranger awareness. Explain the importance of being cautious of who your child is interacting with. Discuss the importance of privacy and not sharing personal information online. Ensuring profiles are private and encourage your child to only accept friend requests from people they know.
- 4. **Parental controls** There is some brilliant software to help keep your child safe online:
 - Life 360 Best for tracking
 - Google Family Link Allows parents to restrict content, approve or disapprove apps, set screen times, and more.
 - FamilyTime A parental control app that helps you monitor and manage your child's digital safety and screen time is a parental control app that helps you monitor and manage your child's digital safety and screen time.

- 5. Healthy Relationships As part of Shaping Successful Futures at St Martins and Horizons we educate all students on healthy relationships. Children form bonds with others at all stages of their development. Forming healthy, positive relationships helps children and young people feel safe, secure and supported as they grow up, but unhealthy relationships can have a long-lasting negative impact. These relationships play a key role in a young person's wellbeing. It is really important we have open conversations about relationships to help your child recognise healthy and unhealthy relationships. When starting a conversation choose the right time, maybe try on a walk together as this can help your child feel more relaxed. Make it relevant maybe a TV programme you watch together and discuss a current story line. Ask questions such as, How do you feel? What do your friends think?
