

Uniform Policy

St Mary and St Andrew's Catholic Primary School



Guide us O God to be the best we can be; in every thought, in every word and every deed.

St Mary and St Andrew's children are encouraged to take pride in a smart appearance when they are in school. We ask that parents/carers support school in maintaining high standards of uniform and appearance for all pupils and follow the guidance below.

We believe that a school uniform is important:

- It looks smart
- Wears well
- Contributes to a sense of belonging and community
- Makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance
- Fosters a feeling of pride
- Is designed with health and safety in mind

Junior Winter Uniform (Owls, Jays and Eagles):

- Navy blue pinafore, skirt or trousers (Girls)
- Grey shorts or long trousers (Boys)
- White shirt
- School tie
- Black shoes (no trainers or boots and low heels)
- Navy blue v-neck sweatshirt with school logo
- Grey or White knee length socks

Infant Winter Uniform (Wrens and Robins):

- Navy blue pinafore, skirt or trousers (Girls)
- Grey shorts or long trousers (Boys)
- Red polo shirt
- Navy blue v-neck sweatshirt with school logo

Summer Uniform:

- Children can wear a red polo shirt instead of white shirt and tie
- Red and white checkered dress
- Navy blue school v-neck sweatshirt or cardigan
- Grey or White knee length or ankle socks
- Black bar shoes or lace-ups (low heels)
- Red baseball cap

Coat: A plain navy blue warm, waterproof coat is needed by all pupils every school day. In winter your children need to be well wrapped up as we get the wind from the sea sweeping across our play areas. Plain navy blue hats, gloves and scarves may also be worn (please ensure that these are named and do not contain sports logos).

Hair: Smart hairstyles support our children's smart appearance. Hair accessories such as slides, ribbons bobbles, etc, should be simple and in school colours. We ask that all long hair with chin length or longer is tied back with a plain bobble - regardless of gender identity.

Any child with short hair must have a simple haircut, with no shaved sections, patterns or lines drawn in. We ask that any holiday haircuts - including bright colours added into the hair or extreme haircuts with patterns and shaved sections are returned to their former, more formal school-appropriate style.

Makeup: No makeup should be worn. No nail varnish should be seen.

Jewellery: Small silver/gold stud earrings only. A watch may be worn. We encourage ear-piercing to be done at the start of the summer holidays so that children are able to remove their studs for PE reasons by the start of the year.

Bags: School Book Bag or Despatch Bag (Navy Blue with Red Contrast). Children may use their own rucksack/bag in the Juniors.

PE: PE kit (Years 1 to 6) Navy blue shorts, navy PE skort, red 'T' shirt, navy blue school hooded sweatshirt/soft shell jacket, navy blue jog pants. Trainers. **This must be worn, instead of uniform, on PE days.**

Children may not wear jewellery during PE lessons. This also applies to earrings but if a child has had their ears pierced recently they will be allowed to cover the earrings with micropore for a limited period of time. If a child wears earrings to school they must be able to remove them.

Every item of uniform and all personal belongings must be clearly labelled. Children must take responsibility for their own things. Staff will not be expected to search for pupils' lost equipment, items of clothing etc
