Dear Parent/Carers,

Welcome to issue 21 of our Newsletter.

Dear Parent/Carer,

I hope you have had a good week.



You will be aware that Parents Consultation Evenings are scheduled for next week. Please sign up if you haven't done so already. You will have the opportunity to discuss your child's progress with their class teacher, celebrate successes and consider next steps. Attendance at school is key. It is important that your child attends school regularly and is on time. We want to make sure that your child has the best life chances in the future and recent research from the DFE shows that missing school for even a day can mean a child is less likely to achieve well in the future.

Think about these questions:

1. If my child has time off at primary school, does it make that much difference?
2. They can catch up eventually, can't they?
3. So a couple of days off isn't that much work missed, is it?

If your child misses school, they miss lessons which may not be repeated. Being absent from school makes it hard to catch up with missed work and affects how well children do.

How much lesson time do they miss when they are off?

- Half day absent = 3 hours of lessons missed.
- 1 day absent = 5 hours of lessons missed.
- 1 week absent = 25 hours of lessons missed.

- 2 weeks absent = 50 hours of lessons missed.

The possible impact for your child.

- They might feel a bit left out.
- They may not know how to do the work.
- They may fall behind and find it difficult to catch up.
- They may have to make friends again.

Monitoring and Supporting Pupil Attendance

Therefore, unbroken attendance and punctuality at school is vitally important for learning. However, we do recognise that there will be times when absence is unavoidable and acceptable. Please see the link to the school's Attendance and Punctuality policy for your information and as a reminder of the processes and policies in place. Please read it and together, we can ensure that our children can get the very best out of school life.

Monday 2nd February the Catholic Church celebrated the Feast of Candlemas

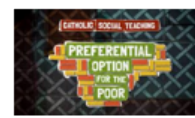
On Monday 2nd February the Catholic Church celebrated the Feast of Candlemas, also known as the Feast of the Presentation of Jesus Christ, the Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary, or the Feast of the Holy Encounter. It is a Christian feast day commemorating the presentation of Jesus at the Temple by Joseph and Mary.



Year 1 children have been learning about this special feast. They invited Father Damian to lead a special liturgy focused on presentation of Jesus at the temple.



Our School Value for this half term is **Kindness** and the matching Catholic Social Teaching Principle is **Option for the Poor**. It is a core principle emphasizing a **preferential love and commitment to the needs of the poor and vulnerable**, seeing their plight as a challenge to the entire community, not just an individual problem, and calling for systemic change, empowerment, and justice, inspired by Jesus' own focus on the marginalized.



It involves actively taking up the cause of the poor, advocating for them, sharing resources, and working for economic systems and societal structures that respect human dignity and ensure everyone's basic needs are met, making them central to moral action.

Year 3 worked really hard this and last week to prepare for their class assembly on Jesus Healing the Leper. It was a great success and we are very proud of their efforts!

We made Predictions based on the cover of the book and compared our findings.

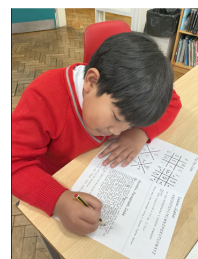
Year 5

Avenue Youth Project Primary AfterSchool Provision

You can now sign up to the Avenue Youth Project for Afterschool Provision, they also provide a walking Bus Service.

ROUTE DETAILS

The walking bus journey begins at St Mary's Primary School main entrance, where children assemble at 2:15 PM. The route takes approximately 10 minutes, with arrival at The Avenues by 2:25. The journey includes four key crossing points, featuring a small crossing on East Flow, another by the park on Harrow Road, followed by a zebra crossing which takes you to the bridge, providing access to Harrow Road. At Harrow Road, the group will cross at the traffic lights and cross again onto Third Avenue.

A WALKING BUS SERVICE

To establish a safe and supervised walking bus service connecting St Mary's Primary School, St Charles Primary School, and The Avenues Youth Project. The walking bus will ensure students in Years 3-6 can access quality after-school activities through reliable, supervised walking routes between the schools and after-school service.

The walking bus addresses the current financial barrier of £15 per day after-school club costs which has limited student participation. The service will incorporate road safety education as an important part of the daily journey.

The walking bus builds on the existing relationship between St Mary's and the Avenues while expanding the reach to include St Charles Primary. Through this coordinated approach, the walking bus will transform access to the Avenues after school activities, making them easily accessible to all students regardless of their families' employment status.!
