Literacy

In Literacy this term our themes are 'animals' and 'transport'. We will be looking at the following key texts to inform our activities.

- -Noisy Farm
- -Rosie's Walk
- -Worried Hen
- -Rosie's Holiday
- -You can't fit an elephant on a bus
- -When your fast asleep



Maths

In Maths we are following the White Rose scheme and below will be our topics this term through a variety of different hands-on activities.

- -Compare and sort
- -Lead won repeats
- -Making patterns
- -Making games and actions
- -Show me 5
- -My own pattern
- -Stop at 1,2,3,4,5
- -Match, sort, compare

Phonics

This term we are continuing to have daily phonics lessons first thing in the morning. Early phonetic knowledge and understanding will help children prepare for reading and writing opportunities in school. In nursery class this is called Rhyme Time.

This term in 'Rhyme Time' we are focussing on Introducing the letters and sounds for-

S, a, t, p, I, n, m, d, g, o, c, k

Children will explore the sounds and words that begin with these letters. We will also be exploring how to correctly form these letters.

RE

In RE children will be learning Branches 5 and 6 and will be listening to the following stories about Jesus.

Branch 5 To the ends of the Earth

Jesus went back to his Father.

He sent a special friend, the Holy Spirit, to look after us.

The parish church is a special place where we meet our friends. We sing and say prayers

Branch 6 Dialog and Encounter

Friends of Jesus: Hear a simple life of St Peter and St Paul, friends of Jesus (linking to their feast day). Invite someone in from the local parish to talk about their faith and why it matters to them to be a friend of Jesus. Explore a range of pictures of Jesus from a non-European tradition.

PE

This term children will be focussing on the following skills.

Creating and Modifying Games - Focus on Cricket / Rounder's and modifications of these games.

Athletics- in preparation for Sports day

In addition to these skills, children are also taught how to play alongside others in a team, solving problems and negotiating roles.

Other areas of development

This term, our topics are Animals and Transport, and we're excited to explore them across all areas of learning. The children will be developing their social skills through group play and learning how to care for animals and each other. We'll be building vocabulary, counting, sorting, and creating through themed activities and play. Outdoor movement, role play, and creative crafts will all help bring the topics to life. We'll also be exploring the world around us by looking at different animals, how we travel, and using our imaginations.

What happens if Class expectations are not followed?

If a child chooses to display negative behaviour, these steps will be taken;

First time a pupil breaks a rule... Reminder (attention drawn to rule)

Second time a pupil breaks a rule... Verbal Warning

Third time a pupil breaks a rule... Second verbal warning

Fourth time a pupil breaks a rule... Third verbal warning: Yellow Zone and consequence.

Fifth time a pupil breaks a rule... Fourth verbal warning.

Sixth time a pupil breaks a rule... Fifth verbal warning: Orange Zone and consequence(s).

Seventh time a pupil breaks a rule... Sixth verbal warning.

Eighth time a pupil breaks a rule... Seventh verbal warning: Red Zone and consequence(s).
