## Literacy

In Literacy this term our themes are 'Winter Wonderland', 'Jungle Animals' and 'Growing'. We will be looking at the following key texts to inform our activities.

- Goldilocks and the three crocodiles
- Walking through the jungle
- Polar bear, polar bear what do you see..
- The extraordinary garden
- Jaspers beanstalk
- The enormous turnip
- Bloom



## Maths

In Maths we are following the White Rose scheme and below will be our topics this term through a variety of different hands-on activities.

- **Subitising**, Show me 1,2,3
- Counting**, Move and label 1,2,3
- **Shape**, space and measure, explore position
- **Pattern**, Explore patterns



## Phonics

This term we are continuing to have daily phonics lessons first thing in the morning. Early phonetic knowledge and understanding will help children prepare for reading and writing opportunities in school. In nursery class this is called Rhyme Time.

This term in 'Rhyme Time' we are focussing on

One, Two, Buckle my Shoe,  
Round and Round the Garden  
Pat a Cake  
Row, Row, Row Your Boat  
Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star  
Ring-a-Ring-a-Roses  
Wind the Bobbin up  
The Grand Old Duke of York.

<p><b>RE</b> In RE children will be learning Branches 3 and 4 and will be listening to the following stories about Jesus.</p> <p><b>Branch 3 Galilee to Jerusalem</b></p> <p>The Wise Men visit Jesus (Matt 2:1-12). Jesus welcomes the little children (Mk 10:v16). Jesus blesses the little children (story retold).</p> <p><b>Branch 4 Dessert to Garden</b></p> <p>Lent is a time to care for others. Jesus died on a cross. It is a sad time. Jesus was given new life by God his Father. Jesus rose and everyone celebrates. Love God and love everyone (great commandment).</p>	<p><b>PE</b> This term children will be focussing on the following skills.</p> <p>-Gymnastics &amp; Movements to Music -Ball Skills / Team Games</p> <p>In addition to these skills, children are also taught how to play alongside others in a team, solving problems and negotiating roles.</p>	<p><b>Other areas of development</b> In Nursery children will also be learning through teacher led and child initiated activities. This term all children will also be learning how to spell their name correctly, forming their letters and using a capital letter for the first letter of their name. Children are also engaging in activities to promote their communication and language skills and we have regular carpet sessions to promote this area of development. In addition to academic learning we have a focus on children's PSED. Ensuring all children are happy and are able to build respectful friendships with others is a crucial development stage this term. We are focussing on broadening our friendships and showing kindness to others in our classroom.</p>

### What happens if Class expectations are not followed?

If a child chooses to display negative behaviour, these steps will be taken;

**First time** a pupil breaks a rule... Reminder (attention drawn to rule)

**Second time** a pupil breaks a rule... Verbal Warning

**Third time** a pupil breaks a rule... Second verbal warning

**Fourth time** a pupil breaks a rule... Third verbal warning: Yellow Zone and consequence.

**Fifth time** a pupil breaks a rule... Fourth verbal warning.

**Sixth time** a pupil breaks a rule... Fifth verbal warning: Orange Zone and consequence(s).

**Seventh time** a pupil breaks a rule... Sixth verbal warning.

**Eighth time** a pupil breaks a rule... Seventh verbal warning: Red Zone and consequence(s).
