We have planted our own seeds in our vegetable garden and turned our roleplay into a garden centre and flower shop. We made our own fabulous flower and herb soups and potions too!

The children have been playing social games focusing on listening and responding to instructions and games that require skills to negotiate space in a safe manner when moving around. They are using vocabulary such as big and small to compare their steps when moving around. and songs. They have been taking turns to explore some basic instruments to learn how it is played.
