
Dear Families,



Our Topic

Down in the Farm:

Our topic this half term is all about animals we find on a farm, their habitats and learning some nursery rhymes around these 'Baa Baa black Sheep' and '5 little ducks' 'Old MacDonald' '5 speckled frogs'. We have an exciting petting farm we have created in the classroom and the children en joy feeding the animals in pretend play. We have read the 'Noisy Farm' by Rod Campbell and this week we are reading 'Rosie's Walk' by Pat Hutchins. You can share these stories with your child at home and learn to say the animal names and noises for them. What other animals do you know on the farm? Have you been to a farm before? Can you also please send in any pictures of your visits to a farm with your child as we would love to have these for show and tell. You can bring them in to school next week please! We will also be making pizzas with our own dough to share as we are learning about where our food comes from. The children have really en joyed pulling out the vegetables in our school garden and talking about the vegetables. We had some enormous parsnips today and what a treat to harvest them! We are also learning about counting objects to 5 and beyond and recognising these numerals too. It really helps to sing songs about animals and using your fingers to show how many. Sharing stories about 3 little pigs, 10 little aliens are also great for getting children to count too!

Every Wednesday

The children have been learning new nursery rhymes and songs. They have been taking turns to explore some basic instruments to learn how it is played.

They are using vocabulary such as big and small to compare their steps when moving around. They are learning to move in a range of ways e.g. jumping, hopping, balancing, skipping, running, walking...

The children have been learning a range of Portuguese words through song, action and rhyme.

How can the little things we do help others? Having some little responsibility for hanging up their coat, tidying toys or setting the table.
