The Catholic faith permeates every aspect of the school's activity.

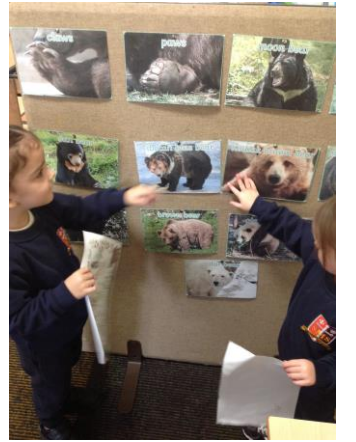
The school's mission statement 'Learning together in Faith and Love' recognises and celebrates the links between home, school and parish.

Applying for a Nursery Place

DOB between 1st September 2022 – 31 August 2023
(the September after their 3rd birthday)

Please complete the Nursery application form which can be downloaded from our website under 'admissions' and return the form along with:

1.Two documents proving current address

2.Child's birth certificate

Forms to be returned by 15th January 2026

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The Governing Body has sole responsibility for admissions to this school and intends to admit the published admissions number of 26 pupils to the Nursery Class in the school year, which begins in September 2026.

There is no automatic progression from Nursery to Reception Classes. Please remember that a separate application must be made on behalf of ALL children seeking admission to Reception Classes including those currently attending the Nursery.

SUBSCRIPTION CRITERIA



Nursery classes

We have a Nursery which is open during school hours and is term time only. We offer a variety of sessions times FREE!

Mornings 8.45am – 11.45am

Afternoons 12.15pm – 3.15pm

30 hours 8.45am – 3.15pm

When you are offered a place you then can find out if you are eligible for 30 hours funded place



How does the funding work?

All nursery aged children are entitled to 15 free hours.

Funding 30 hour places – Working parents may be entitled to a further 15 hours/week (30 hours/Extended Entitlement). To check if you are eligible, please see the link below:

The extended funding does not cover childcare over the lunch break. This will be charged at £3.00 a day. Please provide a packed lunch as lunch is not provided.

Parents who are not eligible for Extended Funding have the option to pay for the extra 15 hours at £7.00 per hour and £3.00 for lunchtime, which equals £24.00 per day.

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Applying for a Reception Place

DOB between 1st September 2021 – 31 August 2022
(the September after their 4th birthday)





How to apply for Reception

All applications are made online centrally to the London Borough of RBKC on a **Common Application Form (CAF)**.
<https://www.eadmissions.org.uk>

The CAF must be completed online via the eadmissions portal above.

You may choose up to six schools.

Write down your choices in order of preference and submit the form online before deadline of 15th January 2026.

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You must also complete the school's **Supplementary Information Form** and return it to the school.

This can be downloaded on our website or ask the office for a copy.

You **must** fill out both forms to be considered for a place for your child in Reception.

Additional supporting documents

Our school will need to see two proof of address letters:

A Council tax letter

A Utility bill

Please note:

Original Birth Certificate and Original Baptismal Certificate (if applicable) must be presented to the office.



What happens if I miss the 15th January deadline?

Your application will be given lower priority than on-time applications

In previous years, some children did not get a place at their older sibling's school because their applications were late.

Some late applications may be treated as 'on-time' if there is an exceptional reason (for example you have just moved into the borough)

You must let the Admissions Team know your reason by (Reason for Late Application Form is available online).

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How will places be allocated?

If the school is over-subscribed, the published oversubscription criteria will be applied to decide who can be offered a place. Each school listed on the application form will be considered against the individual school's oversubscription criteria and your order of school preference is not passed to the individual schools.

Q: Will I be offered more than one school place?

Where the applicant qualifies for a place at more than one school, a place will be offered at the school that was ranked as the higher preference on the application form.

Any lower preferences will be withdrawn and offered to other children

No child will be offered more than one school.

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When do I know my child's school?

All applicants will receive the outcome of their application via email on the date of **16th April 2026**.

Following this you will receive a letter from the school to confirm your place and an invitation to attend a meeting in June.

You must accept your offer within 2 weeks of this date.

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Governors' Fund
