English-Writing

In English this term we will be focusing on the alternative fairy story of Rapunzel, The True Story of the Three Little Pigs and we will begin The Owl and The Pussycat. The children will draw on their understanding of the text and pictures to consider character development, how an alternative tale differs to the original story. They will write two diary entries, a retell of the stories and a wanted poster. We will start to explore poetry.



English-Spelling

We have a daily focus on spelling, a really important part of your child's learning. Weekly spellings will be set as homework and tested on Fridays.



English-Reading






Reading is arguably the most important part of your child's learning and we have guided reading three times a week. It becomes very evident in children's writing when they read regularly. Thus, to best support your child, please ensure they read at home each day and record this in their reading records. This should be a levelled reader from our class selection. Readers need to be brought to school daily.

Maths



In the Spring Term, Year 2 will be covering the following maths topics.

- Money
- Multiplication and Division
- Fractions
- Measurement (Length, Height, Mass, Capacity & temperature)

 <p>Science In Science this term we will be learning about:</p> <p>Everyday uses of Materials</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • how some solid objects can be changed • consider the suitability of materials for a purpose • find out about John McAdam <p>Animals Including Humans</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • how animals have offspring • the basic needs of animals for survival • the importance of exercise, hygiene and diet • observe the life cycle of a butterfly 	 <p>History (Spring 2) Year 2 will explore Real Life Superheroes, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • find out about Florence Nightingale and what happened during Florence Nightingale's her life • explore the life and work of Mary Seacole and identify similarities and differences with Florence Nightingale • identify similarities and differences between medical care now and in Victorian times • explore the work of real life superheroes now • investigate how the roles of some real life superheroes have changed over time 	 <p>Geography (Spring 1) Our Geography topic this term is Australia. We will cover the following areas:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • identifying the continents, North and South Poles, Equator and main Oceans • describing the location of Australia and the ocean that surrounds it • identifying Australia's capital city; understanding that Australia is a continent and a country • researching about Uluru and the Great Barrier Reef • comparing London and Sydney
<p>RE This term we will be covering the following topics: Galilee to Jerusalem - The children will look at how Jesus teaches through parables and miracles. We will explore how we say sorry for our deliberate wrong choices through prayer and how God calls us back to him. We will look at Baptism, and the symbolism of water, and the importance of John the Baptist and the link to Isaiah. Desert to Garden - We will look at how Lent is a time of reconciliation and forgiveness. The children will consider the events of Holy Week and make links between the forgiveness Jesus shows at his Crucifixion and his teachings.</p>	 <p>PHSE/RSE Our PHSE Topic this term is KEEPING SAFE:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • how rules and restrictions help us to keep safe • how to identify risky and unsafe situations • that not everything we see online is true • how to keep safe in the sun • recognise that we have a responsibility for keeping ourselves and others safe • know what 'privacy' means. <p>In RSE we will be following Ten Ten Module 2: Created and loved by God: Emotional well-being and Life Cycles.</p>	 <p>Computing In computing Year 2 will be exploring the following topic. Algorithms and Debugging</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • decompose a game to predict the algorithms that are used • understanding that computers can use algorithms to make predictions • understanding abstraction • understanding debugging
<p>PE-Gymnastics & Dance The children will be developing gymnastic skills, including sequences with increasing control and developing core strength. They will explore different equipment and select for a particular activity. In dance the children will begin to understand different choreographed devices such as mirroring, canon, unison and to create simple dance motifs.</p>	<p>Music The children will explore Pitch, including Dot Notation and Melodic Phrases. They will then use musical conversations to create music.</p>	<p>Home Learning Your child will be set their homework on Fridays, to be handed in on the following Wednesday.</p>
