English-Writing In English this term we start by researching barn owls and writing a non-chronological report. The children will then draw on their understanding of a text to write a character description, a report on water pollution and a persuasive piece of writing on pollution. We will then read a text by Anthony Browne as a lead-in to Year 3 work. The children will begin to explore writing alternative outcomes to the story.

English-Spelling

We have a daily focus on spelling, a really important part of your child's learning. Weekly spellings will be set as homework and tested on Fridays.



English-Reading

Reading is arguably the most important part of your child's learning and we have guided reading three times a week. It becomes very evident in children's writing when they read regularly. Thus, to best support your child, please ensure they read at home each day and record this in their reading records. This should be a levelled reader from our class selection. Maths



In the Spring Term, Year 2 will be covering the following maths topics.

- Measurement (length, height, capacity and temperature)
- Time
- Statistics
- Position and Direction

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Science

In Science this term we will be learning about:

Animals Including Humans

- the importance of exercise, hygiene and diet
- observe the life cycle of a butterfly

Plants

- observe and describe how seeds grow into mature plants.
- find out what a seed needs in order to germinate
- find out what plants need in order to stay healthy.

In "working scientifically" to answer questions, we will undertake fair and comparative tests; observe over time; identify, group and classify and seek patterns.

RE

This term we will be covering the following topics:

To the Ends of the Earth: in this branch of the curriculum we study the events after Jesus' resurrection, including the Ascension, Pentecost and the conversion of Saul. We will also look at the Holy Spirit and the Holy Trinity.

Dialogue and Encounter:

In **Dialogue** we learn about what the church teaches about the relationship between Catholicism and other religions. In **Encounter** we will study a specific religion.



History (Summer 1)

 Year 2 will explore How trains changed the way we lived. The questions we will be answering are:

How did people travel before trains?

Who invented the steam train and how it changed the way we live?

Who was Isambard Kingdom Brunel and why is he remembered? How do we use trains now? How trains and stations have changed over time?

PHSE/RSE

Our PHSE Topic this term is About My Body

- about the similarities and differences between males and females
- about gender stereotypes
- be able to name the main parts of the body (including external genitalia)
- understand that some people have fixed ideas about what boys and girls can do

In **RSE** we will be following Ten Ten Module 3: Created to live in Community: Religious Understanding and Living in the wider world.



Geography (Summer 2)

Our Geography topic this term is **My World** and **Me**. We will:

1.Find out where the UK, the equator and the poles are on a world map.

2.Compare the land features and climate of the UK and Ecuador.

3.Compare the capital cities of the UK and Ecuador4.Find out where different animals live in the world.5.Identify physical and human features in aerial photos.

6.Create a map with a key.



In computing Year 2 will be exploring the following topics:

- data handling;
- programming; and
- online safety.
