English-Writing

In English this term we will be focusing on a variety of genres including: Narratives and Argument Texts, Science texts and Shakespeare. We will also look at the audience and purpose of writing, prediction, selecting appropriate form, proofing and editing skills. Children will draw on their reading and research to develop their own ideas and improve their writing.



English-Spelling

Spelling continues to be an important part of your child's learning. We will particularly focus on spelling rules and patterns. Weekly spellings will be set as homework and tested during the week



English-Reading

Reading remains a vital aspect of your child's education. It becomes very evident in children's writing when they read regularly. Thus, to best support your child, please ensure they read at home each day and record this in their reading journals. This can be from a variety of texts but should include a novel or a chapter book with an appropriate level of challenge.

Maths



This term Year 6 will be covering the following maths topics.

- Ratio
- Algebra
- Decimals Fractions and Percentages
- Area, Perimeter and Volume
- Statistics



Science

In Science this term we will continue our Light Topic before moving on to:

Living Things and their Habitats

- Classification of species.
- Microorganisms
- Grouping based on common traits

Animals Including Humans

Skeletal, muscular and digestive systems

RE

This term we will be covering the following topics: Galilee to Jerusalem- The children will look at how St. John presents Jesus as the Messiah who reveals his kingdom through seven signs. They will also explore the purpose of the sacraments and consider the important roles they play in the life of the Church. Desert to Garden- We will look at the rich symbolism of St John's account of the end of Jesus' earthly life.



History (Spring 1)

Year 6 will explore the following topic. Changing Role of Women -Including
