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# Catholic Life and Mission of the school

#### The Holy season of Advent

In Catholic and Christian communities around the world, the Holy Season of Advent refers to a four week season of remembering and celebrating the arrival of Jesus on Earth.

It's a time to reflect on the nature of Jesus' humble birth and to join in the anticipation of when He will come again to reunite Heaven and Earth once and for all.

#### This week is the first week of Advent

We celebrated the start of Advent with the whole school Mass yesterday, on Thursday 5th December at 9.30am in Our Lady of the

Holy Souls church. The Faith Ambassadors did the Readings and the Bidding Prayers, and three Y6 pupils served at Mass as Altar Servers.

As usual the behaviour and reverence of our children was excellent and, according to Sisters and the parishioners they 'lifted the church up' with their beautiful singing.

Within the Catholic Social Teaching, we are looking in depth and learning about one of the principles: **Dignity of the human person**. This is in conjunction with looking more in depth at the School Value of Respect this half term.

### Mufty Days for donation to Food Bank

The last three years, we have to organised the fundraising for those less fortunate than us in the local community. Therefore, we plan to have another MUFTY day, on which children will be able to wear their own clothes again. In return, we ask for donations of dry and tinned/canned food for the Local Food Bank.

The MUFTY days have taken place on Friday 29th November and today Friday 6th December.















## **Important Parent's Information**

#### Home time

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Just a gentle reminder about home time arrangements. EYFS: 3.15pm – Nursery Gate KS1: 3.20pm - Brown Door (Y1), KS1 Gate (Y2) LKS2: 3.30pm – Back Gate UKS2: 3.30pm – KS2 Gate

We expect all parent/carers to collect their children on time. Once the gates have closed, the children who have not been collected are brought into the office. If there are exceptional circumstance which are causing a delay, please contact the office immediately.

We do not have capacity to look after any children who are not picked up after that time.

As you are aware, the office gets very busy and the children cannot be left unsupervised in the reception area as it might pose the safety risk.

Please, ensure that you have arrangements in place to pick up your children on time.

Aktiva, the company running Wrap-Around Care in the RBKC North Hub in Ark Brunel, does take one-off bookings, so please feel free to use their services in emergencies.

Please, also ensure that we have up to date written permissions for any person you might ask to pick your children up from school as we will not be able to release children into the care of anyone we do not have the permission for.

#### **Parents Information**

#### Uniform

Thank you to the vast majority of our pupils who wear their full school uniform. We have noticed that quite a few children do not have their ties whilst at school. Please, note that the school tie is part of our school uniform. Could you, please ensure that your child wears the tie to school every day,



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Pupils should be wearing **school shoes** when they are not wearing trainers as part of their PE uniform. Quite a few pupils are wearing colourful trainers, which are **not** part of the uniform, and we ask that you kindly check with your child and make sure they wear full school uniform, which includes black shoes.

Please note that if for any reason your child is not in full school uniform or full PE kit, we expect a note from parents to explain why this is the case.

#### Jewellery and Expensive items

As part of our school uniform, the children are allowed to wear small studs. Any long, dangling earrings might be the cause of accidents and therefore are not allowed. If children wear necklaces with any religious symbols, please, make sure that your child is aware that these need to be tucked under the clothing for health and safety reasons.

As you are aware, we advise that children do not bring any expensive items to school, as we **cannot take responsibility for loss or damage**. Only children in Y5 and Y6, who have permission to walk to and from school on their own, can bring phones to school. However, they have to hand them in at the gate and pick them up from their teachers at the end of the day. During school hours the phones are stored in the safe.

Pandora bracelets as well as other bracelets and necklaces or "smart" watches are **not allowed** as they can create a health and safety hazard. In addition, they are often expensive or hold sentimental value.

Additionally, as "smart" watches are connected to other devices via the Internet, they are therefore **not allowed at school** for **safeguarding reasons**. This is in line with government and local authority guidelines and we ask parents to help us ensure that these guidelines are followed.

#### Attendance

Congratulations to all the pupils who achieved 100% attendance this week! Our overall attendance is the same as last week **is 93.00%**. This is very low and as a school community, we need to do much better. Our school target is <u>96.00%</u>.

If required we will arrange to meet with parents, to draw their attention to their children's absence. There is a strong correlation between school attendance and pupil outcomes. Please ensure your child is at school unless they are ill.

#### Holiday during term time

The government policy is that holidays during term times are not permitted, therefore the school **cannot authorise** any absence due to holidays during term times. If you take your child/ren out of school for a holiday during term time, they will be referred to the Local Authority if necessary.



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Please note this for any plans you are making for the new academic year 2024-25. The Department for Education expects parents/carers to organise holidays outside of the school term dates. Your child/ren's learning will suffer by taking them out of school and it may result in disruptions to the learning of others. We have already referred some families to the local authority who will issue a penalty notice.

#### Contacts

It is a requirement that the school has a minimum of **2 emergency telephone contact numbers** for your child. We need to be able to contact you at all times. Our admin team, endeavour to update our data systems with your details termly. This is essential for the wellbeing of your children and we need your help to ensure that you are contactable at all times. If there are any changes for 2024-25, please ensure you contact the school office at the beginning of the new academic year.

#### School Tie

A gentle reminder that all children in Reception to Year 6 are all expected to wear their school ties.

The St Mary's school tie gives the school its unique identity and this is something we want to preserve and promote throughout the local area.





#### New elasticated ties - coming soon!

in response to parent and pupil feed back, we have decided to phase out clip on ties and replace them with elasticated ties. These will be available in the new year.

Staff will be checking to ensure that all school uniform criteria is followed. Thank you for your support

If you are applying for Reception, please ensure you also complete your online application with your Local Authority by January 15th 2025.









# EYFS and Key Stage 1 update

#### **EYFS - Nursery and Reception**

Early Years have had lots of fun creating the famous painting by Vincent Van Gogh called "Starry Night over the Rhone".













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Both classes were able to look at the painting and select what colours we needed to recreate this. Our class texts have both included a river and this joint activity was a really fun way to end our week and bring both classes together.

#### Year 1

Year 1 have been working hard with their phonics this week. Thank you to parents who are reading with their children at home. We are beginning to see great progress! Keep it up Year 1.

#### Year 2

In Science this week, we have been learning about food chains. In this activity, some of the children (krill) collected post-it notes

(plankton), then the silverfish were released to eat the krill, followed by the seals to eat the silverfish, followed by the orcas who ate the seals! We learned that all living things need energy to survive and they get this energy from other living things in the food chain (although plants produce energy themselves from sunlight, water and air). The arrows in the food chain show the way the energy flows.
