Our Computational Thinkers are Invited to Oxford **University Hosted Competition.**

It's that time of year again when students in the UK are invited to take part in the annual Bebras Computational **Thinking challenge.** Pupils are set a series of tasks in which they have to show their logic and problem-solving The aim is to enthuse students in all things



Computer Science, whilst also helping students and their teachers identify hidden talents within the subject. Students are encouraged to simply do their best each year and try and solve as many problems as they can in the time allocated.

This year saw almost 330,000 pupils taking part in the challenge across the various age categories. We are delighted at the efforts of all of our pupils who took part, but particular mention to the pupils who scored 'Best in School' within their age category: Juniors (Year 7) = Evie I, Finlay M; Intermediates (Years 8 & 9) = **James T &** Seniors (Year 10) = **Aaron T.**

Each year the 'Gold' category acknowledges the performance of those pupils scoring in the top 10% of the country! These pupils are invited to the next round of the online competition which takes place in February. This next round is hosted by Oxford University, and I am delighted to reveal that the following pupils have been invited to take part: For the Juniors: Evie I, Finlay M, Olivia E. Meet our Digital Leaders

Y10 Cathedral and Synagogue visit

On the day England had their opening match in the World Cup, a group of Year 10's visited Liverpool's Catholic and Anglican Cathedrals and Princes Road Synagogue, along with Mrs Conway, Miss Jones, Anthony and Mrs Moss.

The purpose of the trip was to explore the design and decoration of the different places of worship studied at GCSE; along with looking at the key features of the building which allow both Christians and Jews to improve their relationship with God.



As we arrived at the Synagogue and were welcomed by the community, very few pupils expected to see what they did when the main doors were opened. The gasps of wonder were clearly heard at the magnificent design and opulence seen within the Synagogue. We were given an in-depth talk and an opportunity to ask questions; and the boys even experienced the wearing of a 'kippah' during their visit as a sign of their respect to God.

We then travelled across to the Anglican Cathedral. Again, pupils were overwhelmed as they entered the Cathedral; particularly at the size of the building and the significant stained-glass windows. We were given a tour of the different transepts before having lunch and then walking down Hope Street to the Catholic Cathedral. The afternoon then gave pupils the opportunity to see the contrast in design of the Cathedrals but also compare it to the design of the Synagogue. Again, pupils were spoken to about the main features of the Catholic Cathedral, given the opportunity to ask questions before we left for home.

A short, whistle stop tour which the pupils enjoyed and will hopefully reap the benefit of when they sit their GCSE's next year.

Under 14's Rugby League



We love to share successes out of school. This half term there have been plenty! Congratulations to all, brilliant achievements. Keep up the hard work.


