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END OF SCHOOL YEAR LETTER 2022

Dear Parents and Carers.

As the school year draws to a close, it is pleasing to be able to report that this year has very much had a sense of 'normality' to it. Whilst it would be foolish to say that Covid has now disappeared, it is fair to say that it has impacted us less and less as the year has gone on.

School closing and September re-opening

School finishes for the summer at 12:30pm on Wednesday, 20 July. We will celebrate Mass at St Mary's parish church, and all pupils will be asked to make their own way home from there. School busses have been arranged to collect from the church.

School re-opens for all pupils on Monday, 5 September 2022, at the usual time, 8:40am. Staff will be in school for 2 INSET days on Thursday and Friday the week before.

School Entrances and Exits from September

From September, there is no need for separate year group entrances. Therefore, all pupils in Year's 7, 8 & 9 will be able to use the pupil entrance outside the bus lay-by. They will then gather on the school yard at the start of the day. Pupils in Year's 10 & 11 will continue to use the side entrance near the main car park.

At the end of the day, pupils will no longer be able to exit school from the main front door, so if you are collecting your child, please check with them which exit they will be using.

Pupil Numbers and Royal Avenue

It is a great blessing that St Mary's continues to grow. The incoming Year 7 is over-subscribed, and this means that the school population will rise to over 800 in September. Sadly, the dimensions of Royal Avenue have not changed and this means that more pupils may well lead to more traffic on the road outside school. If you are using your car, please be considerate of other drivers and the local residents. In addition, please remember to drive safely near pupils at the start and end of the school day. If you can, please park a little distance away from Royal Avenue and encourage your child to walk a short distance to their destination.

Year 8 Pupil Helpers

From September, we will be introducing a new scheme for our Year 8 pupils to be student helpers for the main office. The pupils will help on a rota basis, either in a morning or an afternoon. We hope that this scheme will help to build confidence amongst our younger pupils, and allow them to enjoy a greater sense of responsibility. Depending on numbers, this should take place approximately 3 times in the academic year. The pupils will be seated outside the main office at a desk and will not be privy to any sensitive information. If not assisting with the office, they will be completing work from their class. Appointments during the school day

It is important that should your child need to attend a medical/dental appointment during the day, that you inform school well in advance. Evidence of appointment cards/emails/texts are required before permission can be granted. By having the information in good time, this will minimise any delay for you or your child.

Uniform

As you are aware, St Mary's has high expectations for all pupils in terms of uniform and appearance and, as you would expect, these expectations will be in force from the first day of the autumn term. This includes, amongst other things, no make-up/false tan, no extreme haircuts, no jewellery, black shoes (no trainers) and blazers. Information has already come home regarding expectations regarding footwear for the new 3G pitch. Jumpers will only be required from October half-term.

Building Works

We are delighted that all building work has now been completed and the school will be fully open from September. The top floor of the Mercer block has now been renovated, with Art once again taking its place up there. Of course, our top-quality 3G pitch was completed recently, meaning that St Mary's now has a suite of facilities that can rival any school. It is a wonderful educational environment for your child.

This term we say goodbye to a number of staff. From our office team, we say thank you and goodbye to Mrs Cookson.
