## <u>History</u>

We teach history at St Mary's Catholic High School, Leyland to engage students to develop a love, passion and desire for the subject. As a history department, the curriculum is structured to encourage resilience and an aspiration in the pupils to *let their light shine* becoming a tolerant independent thinker, who can use their knowledge of the past to understand the issues of the present and how they can shape the future. Using knowledge from feeder primary schools about KS2 topics cover we have a curriculum that builds on prior knowledge and understanding and moves towards a firm grasp of the second order concepts required for KS5 and the workplace. Taking into consideration the make-up of our student body, the curriculum is structured to provide opportunities to develop other key skills these include communication, literacy and oracy, key to the overall development of all St Mary's pupils. These will include structures for essay writing, guidance with note taking and opportunities to debate and express their opinions.
