In Modern Languages, we use a lot of target language in the classroom to create an authentic learning experience to ignite pupils' passion and curiosity for language learning. We place a great deal of emphasis on developing skills in the four key skill areas, which are listening, reading, writing and speaking, and pupils are assessed regularly in these areas. With the extensive inclusion of authentic materials, we further develop pupils' command of grammar and literacy skills.

We offer Spanish and French in Key Stage 3 and to GCSE.
