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YEAR 7 NEW STARTERS 2021

Dear Parents and Carers,

I am writing with an update on arrangements for September when your child will start with us in Year 7.

Starting high school can be a mixture of excitement, anticipation and nerves and I am sure that your child will be feeling a mixture of these understandable emotions. Although we haven't been able to run our usual induction programme we have, wherever possible, visited primary schools or held meetings at St Marys and tried our very best to keep you informed about the transition process. School re-opening

As we know, the government has signalled that all legal restrictions regarding Covid-19 will be lifted in England from July 19. Even so, there are still certain expectations being placed upon secondary schools from September which will affect your child.

With this in mind, school will reopen for Year 7 only on Thursday 2 September at 8.45am. This will allow them to meet key staff, find their bearings in the new building as well as experience their first day at secondary school without other year groups and older pupils present. On Friday 3 September, Year 7 will again be the only pupils in school.

Staff will be highly visible in yellow jackets, directing all new pupils in to school on their first morning.

Lateral Flow Tests

All pupils in Year's 7-11 will be asked to undergo two lateral flow tests in school.

For many of our new starters, this may be a new experience. Therefore, on their first day, skilled school staff will be able to guide your child through the lateral flow test. When we returned from lockdown in March this year, we conducted over 1300 tests and pupils found the process both pain- and stress-free. The test involves the pupils swabbing themselves under the instruction of staff.

For this to happen, school must receive consent from you, agreeing for your child to undergo the tests in school. Consent can be given electronically, by filling in the form at the bottom of the following webpage: https://www.lsmchs.com/news/2021-07-12-september-2021

Only if your child returns a positive lateral flow test result, will school contact you with instructions as to what to do next.

Public Health Requirements

Whilst the wearing of face masks will no longer be required in schools, I understand that some of our school community may be a little hesitant as we come out of the Covid pandemic. Therefore, if your child would feel more comfortable wearing a face mask when moving around school or in class, then they will be able to do so. We will review this as the school year progresses.

Similarly, the government is keen to stress that sensible hand hygiene and good ventilation is still recommended. With this in mind, we will still offer pupils regular opportunities for using hand sanitizer, and for doors and windows to be open.

Uniform

No doubt you are keen to see your child in their full school uniform on their first day at secondary school, and this is often a moment when proud parents take photographs! Please can I remind you that St Mary's has high expectations for all pupils in terms of uniform and appearance and, as you would expect, these expectations will be in force from the first day of the autumn term. This includes, amongst other things, no make-up/false tan, no extreme haircuts, no jewellery (including smart watches), black shoes (no trainers) and blazers. Jumpers will only be required from October half-term.

PE Kit will not be required for the first day.

The School Day

Year group bubbles are no longer required in secondary schools. Therefore, we have greater flexibility in arranging the school day. However, we have decided to keep one of the changes we introduced last year, and this is our split breaks and lunch. This means that at both break and lunchtime, Year 7 will only be mixing with Years 8 and 9, as Years 10 and 11 will have their breaks at a different time. Your child's school day will look as follows:

It is always best when your child walks or cycles to school, but please remember that cycle helmets are compulsory for St Mary's cyclists.
