#### Year 10 Cathedral and Synagogue visit:

At the start of July, a group of Year 10's visited Liverpool's Catholic Cathedral and Princes road Synagogue, along with Mrs Conway, Miss Jones and Anthony.

The purpose of the trip was to explore the design and decoration of the different places of worship studied at GCSE; along with looking at the key features of the building which allow both Christians and Jews to improve their relationship with God.

As we arrived at the Synagogue and were welcomed by the community, very few pupils expected to see what they did when the main doors were opened. #### Sports Tour
