
# ST MARY'S CATHOLIC HIGH SCHOOL NEVSLETTER Summer Term (2) 2024

#### FAREWELL TO STAFF


At the end of this academic year we say goodbye to 4 members of staff, one of whom has spent nearly 2 decades working here at St Mary's!

#### Parent Voice Summary
