ANTI BULLYING WEEK 13th-17th NOV



YEAR 10 TRAVEL & TOURISM VISIT TO BLACKPOOL PLEASURE BEACH

Our Year 10 Travel and Tourism pupils visited Blackpool Pleasure Beach for a bespoke presentation by their education team. The team presented to the pupils on how the company uses technology within the park and also how they work with other businesses to attract more tourists to visit. The pupils were outstanding on the day and were a credit to the school.

YEAR 8 GEOGRAPHY FIELDWORK VISIT TO HOUGH LANE

As part of the departments drive on fieldwork within the Geography curriculum, the whole of Year 8 visited Hough Lane to answer the question "Is Leyland a Clone Town?". The pupils completed a land use survey on Hough Lane, analysed the data and began to develop Geographical conclusions.

YEAR 10 GEOGRAPHY FIELDWORK VISIT TO LIVERPOOL ONE & ALBERT DOCK

Year 10 Geography students visited Liverpool One and the Albert Dock in November to investigate the economic and environmental benefits from the regeneration of the area. The pupils conducted interviews, land use surveys, environmental quality surveys and pedestrian counts to as part of their Geographical Enquiry.

YEAR 11 GEOGRAPHY RESIDENTIAL TO AMBLESIDE (LAKE DISTRICT)

On Friday 16th November, Year 11 Geography students visited Ambleside for a weekend residential to focus on enhancing their fieldwork skills and whilst also preparing for their forthcoming mock examinations. The students conducted different Geographical enquiries within Ambleside, focusing on the key aspects of a Geographical fieldwork study.

GREEN CAREERS WEEK

In early November, the school and in particular the Geography department promoted Green Careers Week. Staff within the school promoted sustainability advice (via excellent work by the Eco team) around school. Whilst within Geography lessons, pupils investigated careers which promotes protecting our earth from structural engineers to a garden designer. BUILDING THE FOUNDATIONS TO LET OUR LIGHT SHINE

At St. Mary's Catholic High School, it is our mission to educate young people in the Catholic, Christian way to become students of the modern world. Through our Personal Development programme, we instil the values of Love, Peace and Forgiveness, to allow our children to "Let Their Light Shine".

Personal Development Lessons

Staff are allocated to year groups and specific lessons according to their areas of expertise, based on the three themes of Living in the Wider World, Relationships and Healthy Living. Each theme has been sequenced, designed and taught in line with our Catholic Values. Within our 'Living in the Wider World' Unit each pupil will receive careers guidance using our online Morrisby Careers platform. The St Mary's curriculum also includes a unique and bespoke module for each year group designated especially for our pupils, for example more recently Year 7 received a performance by "Streetwise" for Road Safety and Year 11, external visitors to encourage positive mental wellbeing in preparation for their mock examinations.







Well what a busy half term it has been in the careers education department!!

We started November off with visits from Oxford University to discuss future studies, this followed presentations from all our local colleges to our Year 11 Students. Local colleges have also conducted lunchtime drop ins to support with pupils with their applications and personal statements. Pupils this term have also visited "The National Apprenticeship Show" in Liverpool, BAE systems and not to mention our very own careers fair. Next term we have some more exciting visits planned with Leyland Trucks and Runshaw college to name a few..... Not to mention support from our dedicated careers advisor Mrs. McVey and regular careers education lesson within our Personal Development curriculum.

<u>Introducing Mrs McVey (Careers Advisor)</u>

My name is Mrs McVey and I am the Careers Advisor here at St Mary's. I meet with all pupils prior to them leaving in Year 11 to discuss what their future plans may be and I really enjoy hearing about all the plans that pupils have for their future. I am also responsible for organising the events we have in school such as our careers fair, work experience, careers trips, mock interviews and inviting colleges and training providers into school. In my previous role I have been a teacher and a head of 6th form so I understand the difficulties of having to make choices at 16 in preparation for the next steps, whether that be going to college, getting an apprenticeship or going in to the world of work and that sometimes choices can change. I look forward to meeting with you all and supporting you with your next steps after leaving St Mary's.
