#### **School Context**

- Primary School with nursery provision
- 258 pupils on roll
- 48% Pupil Premium- this will rise with reception intake (National average 21%)
- Ofsted outcome: Good: July 2023
- Catholic School Inspection: Outstanding: July 2019
- School attendance at the end of 2024/2025= 94.53%
- National attendance at the end of 2024/25 = 93.1%

Teaching Staff: 11(FTE) and 3PT Teaching assistants: 14 FT 1PT

- 2. Objective 2
- To continue to embed the quality of pupils' writing across the school by continuing to apply consistent approaches to teaching, modelling and feedback, ensuring writing is purposeful, accurate and engaging.
- 3. Objective 3
- We will further strengthen pupils' confidence and accuracy in spelling by embedding consistent, evidence-based approaches across the school.

### Achievements

- End of KS2 progress in all subjects
- End of KS2 attainment in all subjects
- 74% All pupils achieved RWM compared to 62% national.
- 74% of children achieved GD in SPAG at the end of KS2.
- 42% of children achieved a GLD in reading by the end of KS2.
- KS2 data is above national across the board.

## Priorities...

- Further support SEND, cognition and learning pupils, to make rapid progress.
- Improve spelling in KS2
- Further support in phonics. KS1 maths
