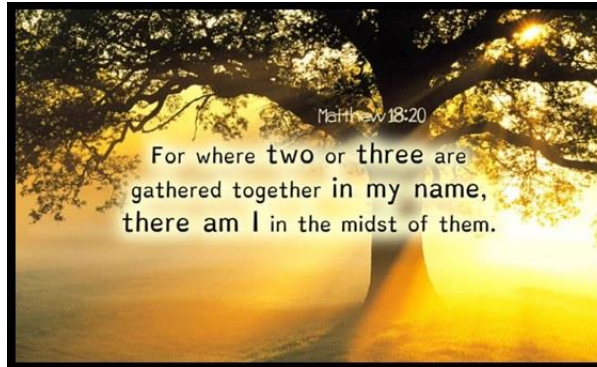

After reading the story love makes a family we drew pictures of our own family we thought about our families while listening to 'The Table of the Lord' song during Liturgical prayer.



Today was our last session for the topic we worked together and made the sign of the cross we discussed our feelings, emotions, some children holding how do you feel when you hear your name? How do you feel knowing the God knows your name? How do you feel that you are precious to God?  
 Some children were happy, excited, surprised, tired  
 The children looked at their name cards and wrote their names then discussed it we placed our names around the prayer space and listened to the song in so special.



Today was our last session from the topic, we gathered together and made the sign of the cross, we discussed our Rights answering some questions including: 'How do you feel when you hear your name?' 'How do you feel knowing that God knows your name?' 'How do you feel that you are precious to God?' Some responses were 'happy', 'excited', 'proud', 'delighted'. The children wrote on their name cards and traced their name with their fingers. They wrote their name and decorated it, we placed our names around the prayer space and listened to the song in so special.



Today some of the children chose to make their hand prints using paint, we reminded them how individual each hand is. (Link to Art, Religious Education)



Today the children gathered around the prayer space and made the sign of the cross, we talked about their first name and family name. The children wrote their name legly and added it to the basket what we said "Please God take care of...". We looked at the 'Name' and read it together, we looked at the picture of the family and talked about how to care for a baby and young child, we discussed the diet and wrapped it in the stories. Everyone checked the diet, we know babies are special and need to be cared for. The children looked at their hand and how it is different to their friends hand. They drew around it and wrote their name. In the end we sang in so special and used in a treasure box, made the box was a mirror, all of the children saw their face and know that they are the precious treasure. In closing time some children decorated the prayer with their finger prints.

Today the children took part in their first RE session. They gathered together and listened to the story Hansy McClary. We talked about all of the unusual names in the story, we talked about their name and also their family name. The children seemed surprised to know that their parents chose their name, we also talked about some names being the same as each other, being named after a family member or a Biblical name, we looked at their name on their key card then they added it to the basket as we sang 'In so special'. The children listened to the scripture quote and I explained that God knows their name. Everyone drew themselves and tried to write their name, we said a prayer with our pictures at the end.





Today the children gathered together.

We looked at our family photographs and talked about how different all of our families are. Everyone knows that their family loves them and God also loves them. The children created a drawing of their family. At the end we said "Thank you God for our family."



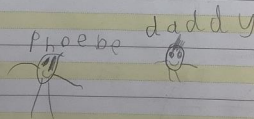
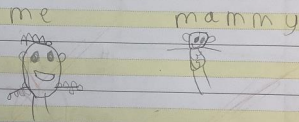

We have thought about how we show love and care to the people around us with our family at home and our school family. We have taken a special message home to our families to let them know how special they are to us.

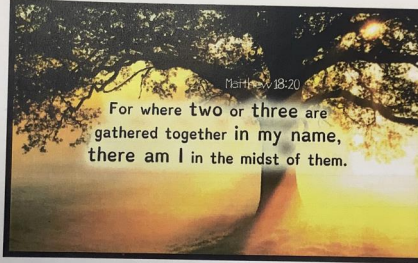

The Beatitudes For Children

When Jesus was a grown-up, he traveled to many towns teaching people about God. One day he sat on a high hill, so that the large crowd could hear and see him better. The things he said that day are called "The Sermon on the Mount". One part of this we call the "Beatitudes".

<p>1. "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God."</p> <p>This means that when you make peace with others, it makes you happy inside. So try to be a friend and make things better when people are upset.</p>	<p>2. "Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy."</p> <p>Being merciful means being kind and forgiving to others, they'll be kind to you too.</p>
<p>3. "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled."</p> <p>This one tells us that if we want to do something good and do the right thing, we'll feel close to God in our hearts.</p>	<p>4. "Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."</p> <p>Sometimes doing what is right is hard, but if you keep trying to be good, you'll find happiness in heaven.</p>
<p>5. "Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth."</p> <p>Being meek means not being too proud or bossy. I instead be gentle and respectful and you'll have good things come your way.</p>	<p>6. "Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted."</p> <p>When you feel sad about making a mistake, it's like saying sorry and God will comfort you and help you do better next time.</p>
<p>7. "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God."</p> <p>If you keep trying your heart full of love and goodness, you'll be able to see God in the beauty of the world around you.</p>	<p>8. "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will be called children of God."</p> <p>When you help others get along and make peace, it's like being a special friend to God.</p>

### Do you have to earn love

The idea of a family expressed in the story of the prodigal son shows us that love does not necessarily have to be earned.

In the parable of the prodigal son, found in the Gospel of Luke, Jesus tells a story about a father who lovingly welcomes back his wayward son with open arms, even after the son spent his inheritance and made poor choices. This story shows us the idea of unconditional love and forgiveness. The father's love for the son is not based on the son earning it, but is a symbol of God's love and forgiveness.

Love doesn't need to be earned; it's like a gift, a way to show kindness and something we should give and receive with faith and forgiveness. These lessons tell us to be loving and caring to others, even if they don't deserve it in the usual way.
