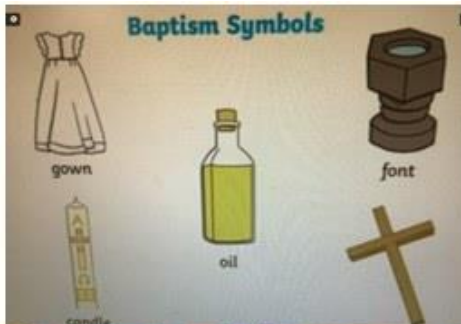
## EYFS

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*Welcome - Baptism: a welcome to God's family*

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Today the children remembered how we welcome people using smiles and greetings. They talked about how new babies are welcomed into the family, then how people are welcomed into the church family through baptism. We talked about the symbols of baptism and what they mean. The children created a picture of each object and tried hard to write labels using their phonic sounds.



Today we revisited the topic of 'welcome'. We talked about how we are made to feel welcome and how we show others that they are welcome. We talked about how new babies are welcomed into families, then how people are welcomed into a church. During our discussion we were reminded that people can be baptised at any age.

We then drew some of the symbols of baptism and talked about each one and why they are part of such a special sacrament. I have attached some examples of our beautiful drawings.



Today we started our new topic 'welcome', we talked about belonging to our school family and how we were welcomed into school on our first day.  
The children generated ideas about being welcomed and later we made a welcome poster.





Today the children found out about how people are welcomed into the church family. They used vocabulary for Priest baptisms, font, candle, show, Christ and baptism.

The children took part in a role play baptism. They found out about the words the Priest says when he baptises someone, why an ounce shell is used to pour the holy water and the importance of wearing white after baptism to represent new life.

The children were interested to find out that people can be baptised at any age and looked at some photographs of Mrs. Briggs' children who were baptised at the ages of 1, 4 and 8 months.



Today the children found out about how people are welcomed into the church family. They used vocabulary for 'Please godparents, font, candle, show oil and baptism'. The children took part in a role play baptism. They found out about the words the Priest uses when he baptises someone. The children were interested to find out that people can be baptised at any age.



Today we revisited how people are welcomed in different places. The children could recall some things such as smiling and saying good morning. We looked at a picture of a family getting ready for a new baby. The children discussed what they knew and didn't know about welcoming a baby. We then had a visit from three lovely mums and their beautiful babies. The children enjoyed asking questions and learning about how the babies are cared for and how they were welcomed into the family. Thank you to our lovely visitors.



Today the children started their new topic welcome. We talked about the word and the types of places they are welcomed such as school stops and cafes. The children thought about how they are welcomed and looked at photographs of people being welcomed. A smile, greeting hand shake, cuddle are all good ways of greeting people we decide. The children discovered that they are part of our school family as well as their home family. We discussed that this means we take care of each other. The children worked together to make some welcome posters for our school.





Today we started our new topic 'welcome'. We talked about belonging to our school family and how we were welcomed into school on our first day.  
The children generated ideas about being welcomed and later we made a welcome poster.

A Parent

What else do we know about Baptism?

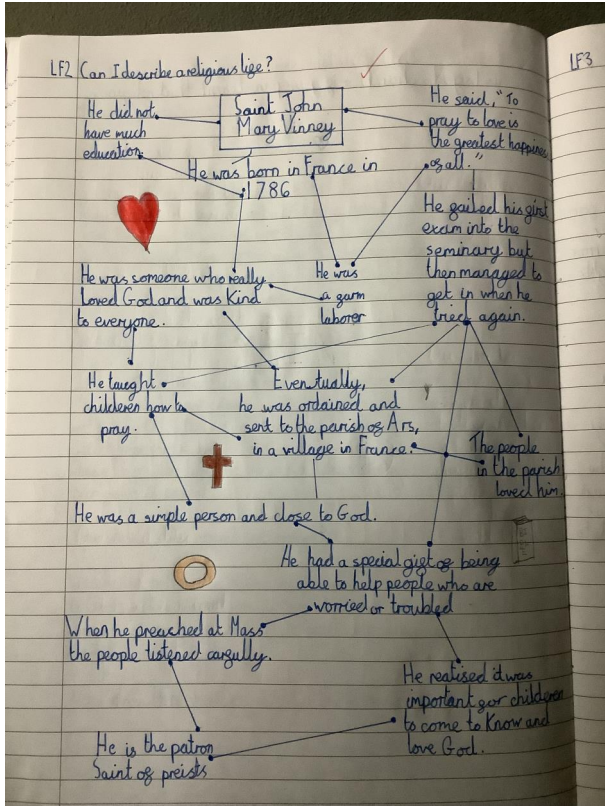
