Celebrations - People celebrate in Church



Today we looked at pictures of celebrations and talked about different ways to celebrate. We also listened to the story Simon and Anna and talked about the characters and what was happening. Some of us spotted the difference between celebrating and not celebrating.





Today the children answered a range of questions about celebrations. We also talked about Simon and Anna and what they could remember from the story. I recorded some of their answers as notes.
 We revisited the features of church and talked about the celebrations that happen in church.
 The children enjoyed role playing a wedding and finding out about the different people in the wedding.



Today the children gathered together and set out our prayer basket. We discussed ordinary time and how that is represented using the green cloth. We talked about the Bible and how it tells us stories of all the wonderful things God and Jesus have done. We also talked about the crucifix and how that is a symbol of a Jesus' love for us, then we lit the candle which is to show Jesus the light of the world.

The children listened carefully to the story of Mary and Joseph taking Jesus to the Temple to thank God for their gift. They understood that Simon and Anna were very happy.

The children made a candle to remind themselves that Jesus is the light of the world. We held our candles and watched them while singing the song 'Yes Lord I Believe'.



Today the children gathered together and set out the special objects. We discussed ordinary time, and the Law and Old Testament of the Bible. I explained we were going to hear a Bible story.

The children listened carefully to the story of Mary and Joseph taking Jesus to the Temple. They understood that Simon and Anna were very happy.

The children made a candle to remind themselves that Jesus is the light of the world. We held our candles, set our chairs out like a church and sang the song 'Yes Lord I Believe'.



Today the children sang gathered as one, we talked about the church family and how people feel when they go to church. The children were introduced to the word Mass and we talked about what happens. The children heard the phrase, "The Lord be with you" and the response "and with your spirit".
The children worked in pairs to create a welcome to mass poster.








The children looked at an image of St Mary's Church, we discussed the name and who we meet there, we discussed our Church Family and spoke about a place where we feel we are welcomed and part of it. We looked at pictures of celebrations and special times in the church, we used vocabulary of baptism, mass, Easter, Christmas, wedding. The children were interested to see pictures of objects inside the church and we named them and spoke about how they are used, we use the vocabulary for altar, pews, hymn books, candle, font, stained glass window. Some children talked about their own experiences of visiting church. The children drew the objects they had found out about. Some children also drew the outside of the church.

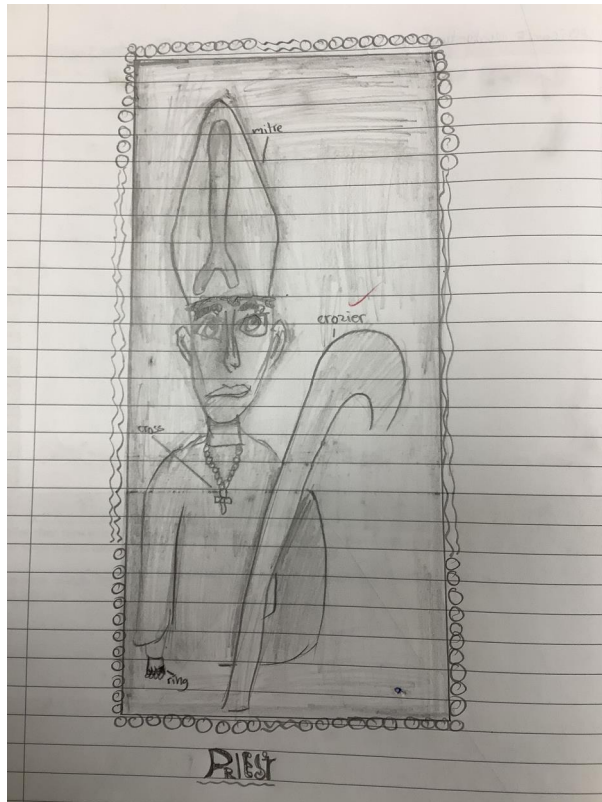

THE BISHOP

A Diocese is made up of many parishes.
 The Bishop leads the Christian family in his Diocese.
 The main church in a diocese is called a Cathedral. 'Cathedral' comes from a Latin word meaning 'seat' so the cathedral is where the diocesan bishop has his 'seat'. This is the symbol of his responsibility and authority and he takes his seat here when he celebrates Mass. Bishops are the successors of the Apostles.
 The role of the Bishop is to unite all the parish families within a diocese. He does this through visiting each parish, celebrating confirmation, ordaining men to the priesthood and deaconate and proclaiming the Gospel. He is like a shepherd in the way he looks after and cares for his people as a shepherd cares for his sheep.
 The mitre is worn on his head and symbolises the two sources of his authority - the Bible and the Church.
 The cross shows he walks in the footsteps of Christ.
 The ring shows he is faithful to God and to leading his people.
 The crozier is a symbol of how he is like a shepherd.

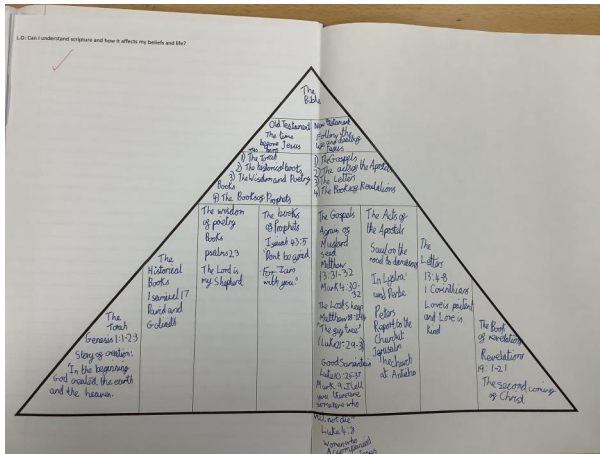

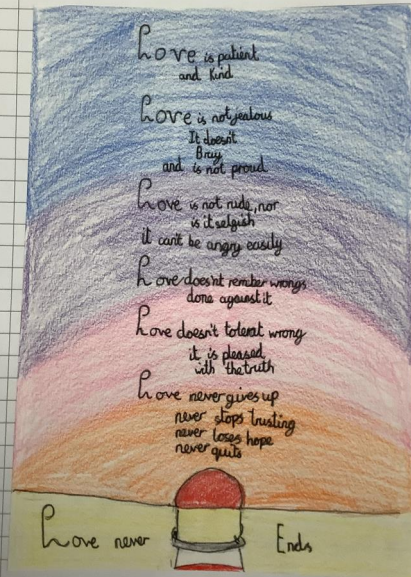
