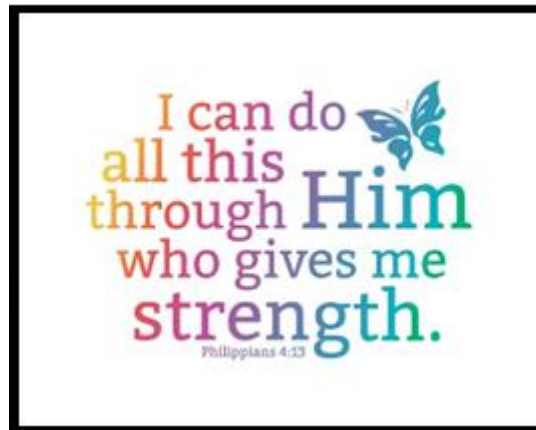

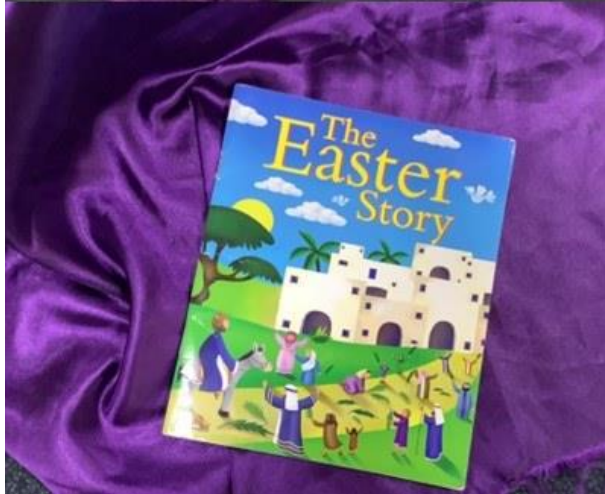

Growing - Looking forward to Easter



The children have enjoyed decorating eggs this week, we talked about how life being hid inside of an egg and that this helps us to remember spring and Easter. Today the children listened to the Easter story and we talked about rolling the stone away from the tomb. The children enjoyed rolling their eggs down the hill on the big field.





We gathered together round the prayer basket and have been focusing on the Easter story this week we read the story then looked at examples of Easter gardens which included 'stone' forms and the three crosses on Calvary we designed our own Easter garden on paper then at last a class Easter garden we are excited to see the flowers and grass start to grow 🌱🌻







Today we revisited our learning about Lent we discussed how things grow in spring and how people can grow in love during Lent. The children listened carefully to the Easter story we looked at an Easter garden and designed our own.







The children talked about Spring time, and what happens. They discussed trees, grass, blossom and flowers. The children looked at seeds and tubs and talked about what they will need to grow like compared the seeds and tubs. The children watched a time lapse video of seeds growing.

The children listened to the story once. There were giants. They discussed how they have changed since being born. The children looked at the baby photos and tried to identify themselves. They then compared the toddler photo and talked about changes they've gone through.





Today the children were introduced to Lent. They looked at the cross and crucifix and talked about how they were different. The children learned a new song about Lent. They also found out Lent started on Ash Wednesday and lasts for 40 days. The children talked about ways to be extra good during Lent. Some ideas were, kind hands, give, share, help others, play nicely. They drew around their hand and wrote a Lenten promise. We made the promises into a cross.

At school we are collecting coins and this during Lent.





Today we talked about pancake day, we discussed the start of Lent.
 Mrs Briggs measured the ingredients and explained what all of the equipment was. The children watched carefully as Mrs Briggs cooked the pancakes. They were very excited to see the flip.

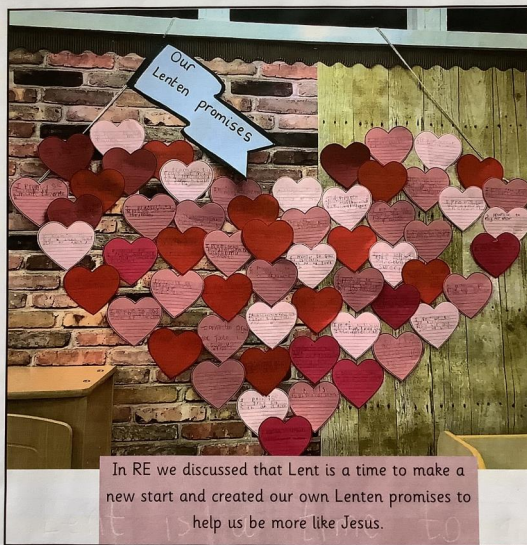

As Jesus and his disciples were getting close to Jerusalem they came to the Mount of Olives.

He sent two of his disciples on ahead and told them, "Go into the village over there. You will see a colt tied up, that no one has ridden yet."

"Untie it and bring it to me. If anyone asks you what you are doing, tell him 'The Master needs it now and will send it back.'"

They went off and did as Jesus said. Jesus mounted the colt. As he rode along people spread their cloaks on the road. Some cut branches and spread these before him.

The people were all shouting, "Hosanna! Praise God! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna! Praise God!"

Jesus said, "I will remember you today and always."

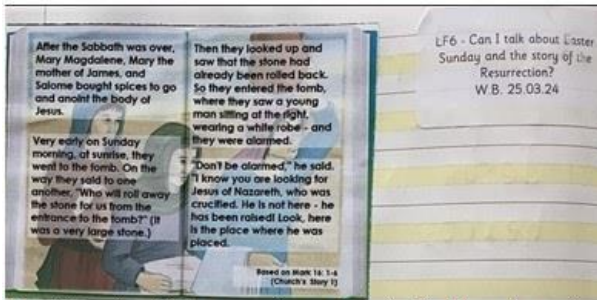

Peter was horrified and tried to refuse. "You shall never wash my feet," he said.

This was the service done by the lowest of all the slaves.

Then Jesus told him, "If I do not wash you, you cannot share my life."

At this, Peter said, "Then, Lord, wash not only my feet, but also my hands and my head."

When he had finished, Jesus explained exactly what his action meant.

"Do you understand," he said, "what I have done for you? You call me Master and Lord, and rightly; so I am. If I then, the Lord and Master, have washed your feet, you should wash each other's feet. I have given you an example, so that you may copy what I have done for you."

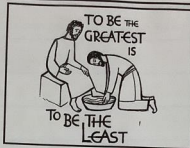
1. People pray the stations of the cross during Lent because everyone should remember Jesus' death.

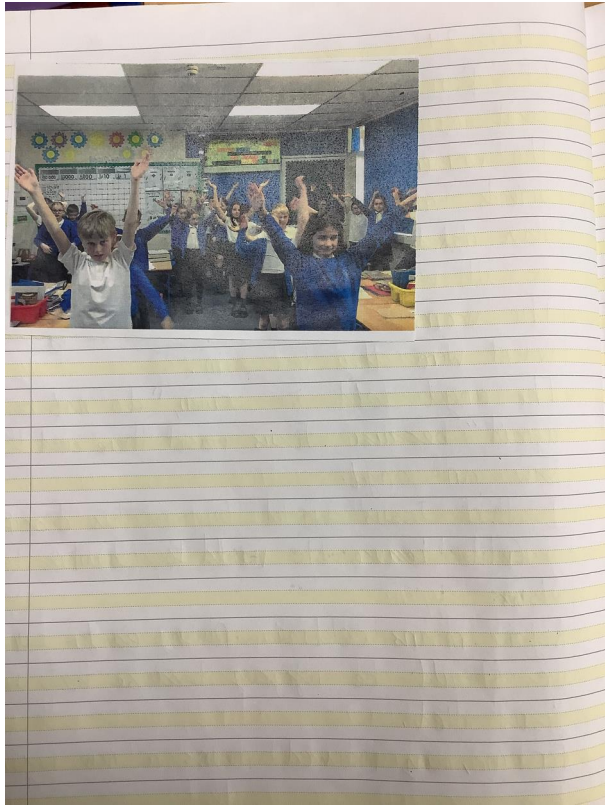

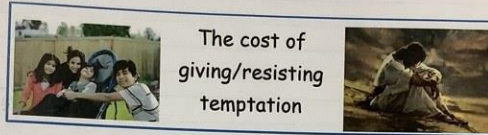

LENT

Lent is the Church's season for discerning and doing good in the Christian Year. Lent precedes and prepares for Easter. It is a penitential season and a time of spiritual growth. If people want to be followers of Jesus, they must be prepared to notice what others need and then see what they can do to help. During Lent, this is traditionally put into practice through prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Christians make Lenten promises saying what they hope to do during Lent.



Lent is a time of year where we give something up or fast. It lasts 40 days and ends on Easter Sunday. It starts on Ash Wednesday.

Ash Wednesday is the start of Lent. You traditionally would get a cross made of ashes on your forehead to show signs of Jesus. This shows that Jesus was tempted so we should respect him.

When they reached the place called Gethsemane, Jesus said to his apostles, "Sit here while I go over there to pray."
He took Peter, James and John with him. He was very frightened and he said to them, "My heart is ready to break. I'm so terrified of what is going to happen to me. You stay here and stay awake."
He went a little further on, threw himself on the ground and prayed. "Father," he said, "You can do anything. Take this suffering from me: but I will do what you want, not what I want."
He came back and found his disciples asleep and he said to Peter, "Simon are you asleep? Could you not stay awake even for one hour? Stay awake and pray."
He went away once more and prayed saying the same words. Then he came back and found them asleep again. They could not keep their eyes open, and they did not know what to say to him.
When he came back a third time he said to them, "The son sleep on now and have your rest. The hour has come. I am going to be betrayed and handed over to violent people. Get up! Let us go!"
No longer is not very far away.
He was still speaking when Judas, one of the twelve apostles came with some soldiers. They were armed with swords and clubs. They had been sent by the chief priests, the members of the law and the elders. Judas had said to them, "The one I look for is the one you want. Arrest him and make sure he is well guarded as you lead him away."
As soon as Judas arrived, he went up to Jesus and said, "Rabbi," and kissed him.
Then they took hold of Jesus and arrested him.

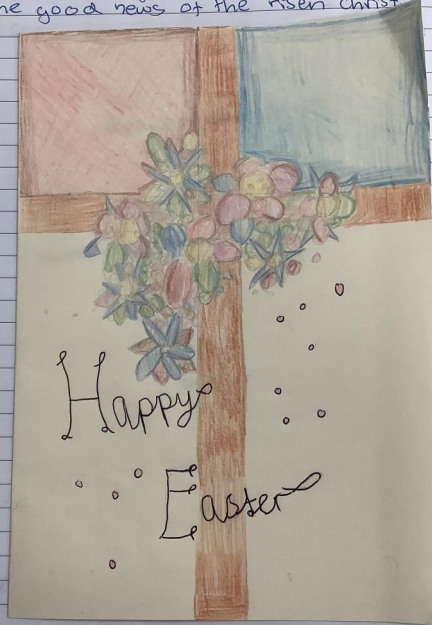

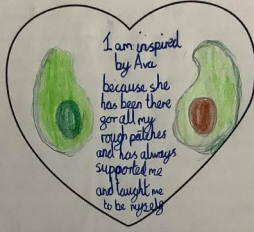

The paschal candle represents Jesus' resurrection and triumph over death and is a symbol of hope and new life.

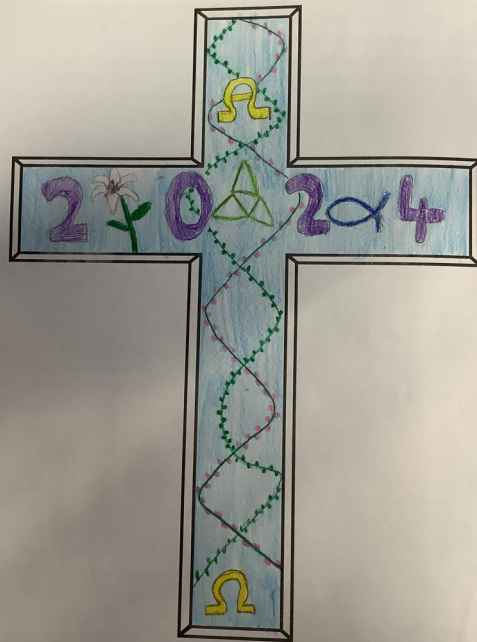
Revelation 22 I am the Alpha and the Omega, the first and last, the beginning and the End.

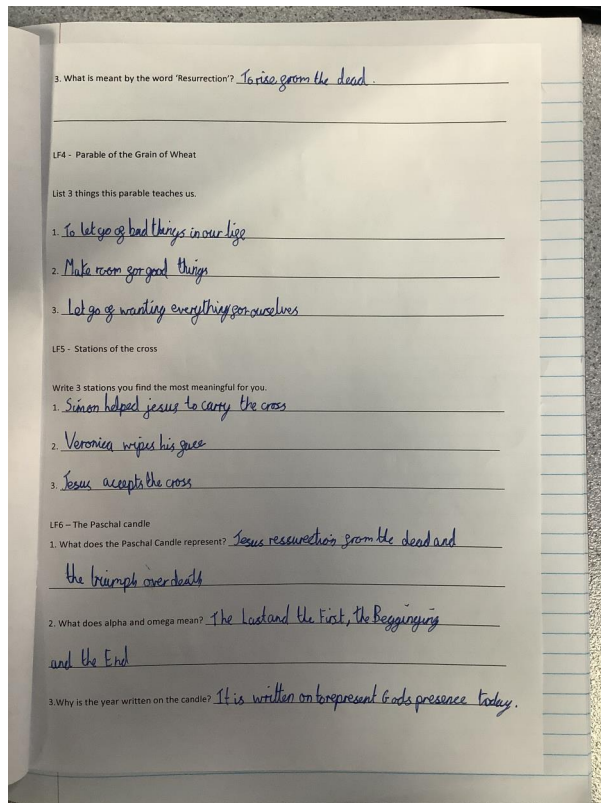
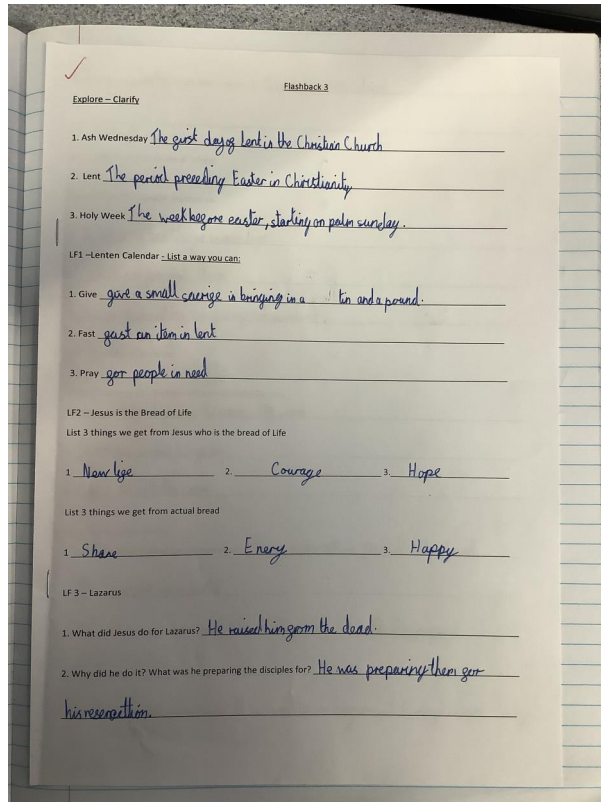
The candle is blessed and inscribed with the cross, the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet and the current year. The year is written on the candle to represent God's promise.

Five grains of incense are put on the candle to represent the wounds Jesus suffered on the cross.

The three nails that pierced his hands and feet, the spear thrust into his side and thorns that crowned his head.

Everyone in our school contributed to the design of the St. Marguerite church Paschal candle. Our job was to design the cross.



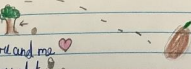

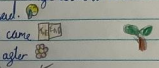

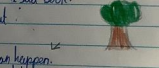


In our Catholic faith, we believe that we go to heaven after we die. And it's not the end for them. They go with God. It's abit like a happy ending after a sad book.
