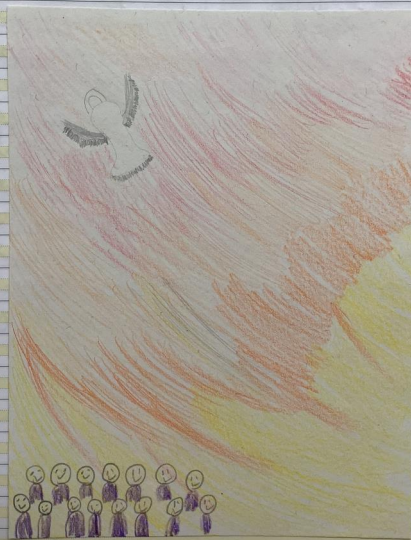

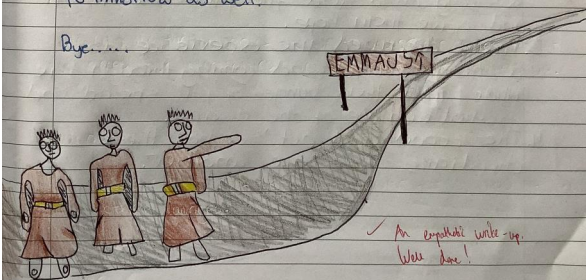
Q: Can I write about the disciples who met Jesus on the road to Emmaus?

### NEW LIFE: A NEW BEGINNING

The friends of Jesus could not believe what had happened. They were devastated when Jesus died and they were given no hope for the future. The great news that Jesus is the same and yet different. They are surprised and delighted.

ON THE ROAD TO EMMAUS (based on Luke 24:13-35)

On the Sunday evening two disciples were on their way to Emmaus, a village seven miles from Jerusalem. They were talking about everything that had happened and did not recognize the stranger who joined them as they walked along.

"What are you talking about so sadly?" he asked them.

They turned to him, their faces full of their sadness. The disciple named Cleopas answered him. "You must be the only person in Jerusalem who does not know all the things that have been going on these last few days?"

"What things?" Jesus asked.

"What happened to Jesus of Nazareth," they said, "the great prophet who showed by all he did and said that he was sent by God. Our chief priests and leaders handed him over to the Romans and he was crucified. We had hoped that he was the Promised One who would set Israel free. This morning, some women went to the tomb where he had been buried and came back saying they had seen a vision of angels and that Jesus was alive. Some of our friends went to the tomb and found it empty as the women had said, but they didn't see anything of Jesus." Jesus said to them, "How does your eye believe? Don't you remember the promises of the prophets about the Christ who would suffer and rise to new life?"

Q: Can I recognise how we can use the Holy Spirit to spread the message?

### PENTECOST (based on Acts 2:1-43)

When the harvest was being gathered in, on the feast of the first fruits, the friends of Jesus were not among the holiday crowds celebrating Pentecost in Jerusalem. Instead they were hidden away in a quiet room. Mary, the Mother of Jesus was with them.

Without the warmth of Jesus' presence among them, they felt stranded and clueless. When Jesus had walked and talked with them, their hearts had burned within them; but now there was a death-like stillness and silence within them, which chilled their hearts and froze their power to act.

Then on that Pentecost morning, everything changed. The friends of Jesus knew all would be well.

They described the experience like this. They said it was as if a strong, powerful wind had filled the whole house and as if tongues of fire had spread out and touched each one of them. They felt alive as never before. The warmth of God's love circulated through and among them, so that they felt compelled to rush out and share their joy with the whole world and to witness to the Good News of Jesus.

1. The feelings of Jesus' followers changed from being clueless and deserted to being trustful and joyful.
2. Their attitude changed because a strong wind and fire filled the room and gave them hope.
3. People described the experience as, a strong powerful wind coming through the whole house, then tongues of fire spread and touched each one of the disciple.
4. The crowd cried out 'See how these Christians love one another.'

At that very moment I saw again and looked at him. He said, "The God of our ancestors has chosen you to know his will, to see his righteous Servant, and to hear him speaking with his own voice. For you will be a witness for him to tell everyone what you have seen and heard. And now, why wait any longer? Get up and be baptised and have your sins washed away by praying to him."

Based on Acts 22: 6-16

I believe that Ananias asked Saul to be baptised because of the he was behaving.

Saul was transformed by the Holy Spirit into a respectful person.

**George Muller**

George Muller is best known for caring for thousands of orphans over the course of his life. He relied on God to provide for all their needs. Muller also quoted a saying: "The Lord not only gives as much as is absolutely necessary for his work, but gives abundantly." His life is a testimony of miraculous provision and miracles guided by power of prayer.

**Mary Slessor**

Her missionary life began in Nigeria and worked fearlessly in regions where many missionaries before her had been slaughtered. In these regions there were slaves, bad customs and they were abandoned in the jungle. So Slessor rescued all these children and saved thousands of lives.

**Tim and Elizabeth Elliot**

This story begins when Tim journeyed to reach the Mursi tribe in Ecuador. After he arrived he was attacked and was martyred. After this news Elizabeth returned to preach the gospel to the Mursi and lived there for seven years.
