#### Length of School Week Consultation

In the March 2022 Schools White Paper, it was announced that the minimum expectation of a school week is 32.5 hours. Whilst this is non-statutory, the Government expects schools to have this in place by September 2024. Most schools in England already deliver a school week of 32.5 hours or more, St Mary's currently delivers 31.67.

A core school week is the time from morning registration to the official end of the school day for all pupils (including breaks). In simple terms, to have a school week of 32.5 hours we need to have a school day of 6.5 hours. At the moment, we have a school day of 6 hours and 20 minutes (0855 – 1515). Therefore, we have to find an additional 10 minutes each day.

We want a solution that causes the minimum amount of disruption to both parents and staff and has the most positive impact on pupils. Our next step is to consult with the whole school community. Please look out for the consultation that will be sent out to you next week.

#### Parent Questionnaire Feedback

The feedback from the recent parental questionnaire was extremely positive; parents and carers are proud of our school. Thank you for your time and consideration in completing it.
