COVID update

As you will probably be aware, the Government advice regarding what to do if you have coronavirus (COVID-19) or symptoms of COVID-19, has changed today, April 1. Access to free testing has also been removed for most people. What does it mean for us at school?

When children with symptoms should stay at home and when they can return to education.

Children with mild symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat, or slight cough, who are otherwise well, can continue to attend school and nursery.

Children who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can come back to school and resume normal activities when they no longer have a high temperature and they are well enough to attend.

Testing positive for COVID 19

If a child tests positive for COVID-19, they should stay at home and avoid contact with other people for **3 days**. **This starts from the day after they did the test.**

Children and young people tend to be infectious to others for less time than adults. If they're well and do not have a temperature after 3 days, there's a much lower risk that they'll pass on COVID-19 to others.

PE kits summer term

For the time being, we are still asking children to come to school in PE gear on the days they have PE to avoid the necessity to change into kit. However, we also want to take the opportunity to return to us all wearing the correct PE uniform kit for our PE lessons.

All children from reception to Y6 should wear either the school PE top or a white short-sleeved Tshirt along with either black or blue shorts. They should also wear trainers for the outdoor PE lessons. I know some of the older children might be more comfortable travelling to and from school in leggings/tracksuit bottoms, but they should be a darker colour e.g. black or blue too.

Children can wear their school jumpers or cardigans over PE tops if the weather is cooler, so there is no longer any need for children to bring in any other type of sweatshirt, hoody, track suit bottoms or jogging bottoms.

Chorley Schools Sports Partnership (CSSP) Cross Country Championships

Last weekend, St Mary's was represented by a large number of children in the CSSP Cross Country Championships at Astley Park. They were well supported by mums, dads, brothers, sisters and grandparents too. There were Y3/4 girls and boys races, Y5/6 girls and boys races and a huge 'fun run' to finish.

This involved:

- 131 runners in the Year 3/4 Boys Event
- 123 runners in the Year 3/4 Girls Event
- 128 runners in the Year 5/6 Boys Event
- 114 runners in the Year 5/6 Girls Event
- And in the fun run there were 300 plus runners!



The St Mary's runners performed superbly and had a lot of fun on a beautiful spring morning; each of our teams finished in the top 10. Great effort!

Free School Meals – Are you missing out?

Free School Meal Eligibility and Pupil Premium Funding

Because all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a free school meal, many parents do not realise that they might be entitled to something called **free school meal eligibility**. And we understand why this might be the case because the system is confusing! At St Mary's, we have noticed a fall in the number of infant children whose parents have claimed eligibility since the introduction of free school meals for all infants –other schools have noticed the same.

This free school meal eligibility can be applied for in Reception, Year 1 and in Year 2 even though children are receiving a school meal anyway. And parents in Y3, 4, 5 and 6 can also apply.

Why bother applying if your child is receiving a free meal anyway?

If you think you might be eligible it is very much worth applying for two reasons:

1. Your child <u>will continue to receive free school meals on leaving the infants in Y3, Y4, Y5 and Y6</u> and beyond

2. The school receives additional money (pupil premium) for children eligible for free school meals (over £1 300 per pupil).

If you receive any of the benefits below, St Mary's School can access this extra funding, called pupil premium.

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit

How can you find out if you are eligible? Apply by phone – and you can find out in a matter of minutes!

You can ring the local Free School Meals and Pupil Premium team on 01772 531809

It must be the person claiming the benefit that rings.

You will need to provide your:

- Name
- Date of birth
- National insurance number

They will confirm whether you are entitled over the telephone. Apply by post
