#### School finances

Schools across the country are going to face a challenging year setting budgets, from next April. Like all areas of society, they are being affected by increasing energy costs, increasing costs of products and services and wage increases. St Mary's school is no different.

The Chancellor announced a £2 billion increase to school budgets in the recent minibudget. We do not what the impact of that will be yet but we do expect to be looking to make savings or thinking of ways to generate income where we can next year and in the years ahead.

our first priority, when making any finance decisions, is to provide your child with the best possible education. We will also ensure that our pupils continue to be comfortable, healthy and safe in school.

#### Year 6 Visit to London 23 – 24 November

Last Wednesday, Mr Cahalin took his Year 6 class on an unforgettable trip to London. Over the course of two days: they travelled on the London Underground; went to the Science Museum; dined at the Hard Rock Café on Park Lane; watched a show, *Wicked*, at the Apollo Victoria Theatre; took a tour of the Palaces of Westminster; met Sir Lindsay Hoyle in the Speaker's House and enjoyed a walking tour of the sites of central London – even spotting King Charles III leaving Buckingham Palace.

It was a once-in-a-lifetime visit. The tour of Parliament, in particular, was fantastic. Sir Lindsay Hoyle had arranged for over 500 children from Chorley to come and experience Parliament on Speaker's Day last Thursday – apparently, he had originally wanted to call it Chorley Day. During the visit, our children sat in the public galleries of the House of Commons and the House of Lords and enjoyed an excellent lesson in the Parliament Education Centre. The highlight of the visit, however, was meeting Sir Lindsay Hoyle in the Speaker's House. He took a question and answer session with the children in the splendid state dining room in the Speaker's House. If you ask the children, they would say that they had an amazing time. Thank you to Mr Cahalin for his meticulous planning and organisation; thank you to Mrs Bradley and Mrs Blackwell from school and thank you to our governors, Mrs St John and Mr Jenner for coming along and making the visit so successful.
