Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to the spring second-half term. The children, as always, have made an excellent start and have had an enjoyable week especially with World Book Day activities.

Russia's invasion of Ukraine

I think we would all agree with a statement by the DfE this week that 'Russia's invasion of Ukraine is distressing and concerning' to children. It is distressing to adults too. Children may have questions and need reassurance. We feel that we can help in school with this.

Teachers have been telling me about how they have been trying to reassure children in their classes. For example, one child was worried when an adult in school had said it was 'World War 3 on Friday,' but they had misheard and what the adult had actually said was that it was 'World Book Day on Friday.' That gives us a sense of how much it may be preying on some children's minds.

When we talk to the children about the invasion, we aim to answer their questions as best we can and reassure them as much as we can. Sometimes it can be as simple as showing the children a map of Ukraine and its neighbouring countries; even showing them that this is happening at some distance from us and that they are safe here. Sometimes, it can be talking about what is happening in a level of detail appropriate to the age of sensitivities of the children.

I have attached a *Picture News* article we might typically use in some classes in school which you might find helpful in your discussions at home. If your child is worried and concerned, please let them know that they can talk to an adult in school about.

In our daily prayers, we pray for peace and cessation to violence, for those who are victims to the invasion and for those fleeing the country.




We hope the children have had a great day and enjoyed celebrating their favourite authors and the pleasure they gain through the wondrous world of books.

Over the course of this term, the hours of daylight will lengthen and I think we can sense that happening already. Hopefully, it will begin to warm up a little bit too. However, in the unlikely event of a very heavy snowfall and the need to close the school, we will inform you via the *GroupCall* text, announcements on the local radio and via the school website.

Free School Meals - Are you missing out?

Free School Meal Eligibility and Pupil Premium Funding

Because all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a free school meal, many parents do not realise that they might be entitled to something called **free school meal eligibility**. And we understand why this might be the case because the system is confusing! At St Mary's, we have noticed a fall in the number of infant children whose parents have claimed eligibility since the introduction of free school meals for all infants —other schools have noticed the same.

This free school meal eligibility can be applied for in Reception, Year 1 and in Year 2 even though children are receiving a school meal anyway. And parents in Y3, 4, 5 and 6 can also apply.

Why bother applying if your child is receiving a free meal anyway?

If you think you might be eligible it is very much worth applying for two reasons:

- 1. Your child will continue to receive free school meals on leaving the infants in Y3, Y4, Y5 and Y6 and beyond
- 2. The school receives additional money (pupil premium) for children eligible for free school meals (over £1 300 per pupil).

If you receive any of the benefits below, St Mary's School can access this extra funding, called pupil premium.

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit

How can you find out if you are eligible? Apply by phone – and you can find out in a matter of minutes!

You can ring the local **Free School Meals and Pupil Premium team on 01772 531809** It must be the person claiming the benefit that rings.

You will need to provide your:

- Name
- Date of birth
- National insurance number

They will confirm whether you are entitled over the telephone. Apply by post
