Did you know...? November is National Non-Fiction Month

National Non-Fiction November was set up by the Federation of Children's Book Groups as a way to highlight the importance of information books and to promote reading non-fiction for pleasure.

Each year, National Non-Fiction November has a different theme. The theme for 2022 is Communication.

Books for birthdays.

Celebrating children's birthdays in class with children's books, rather than bags of sweets, is something we are giving a go this year. We thought that rather than buying sweets for the whole class to celebrate a child's birthday, children could donate a book on their birthday to the class library. Over time, this would really expand the book collection in each class with titles and authors we know the children really enjoy. During the course of each year, we have *Ebb & Flo* bookshop deliver gift-wrapped books to each class. You would not believe the excitement that causes even in the older classes! So, it's something we know the children will enjoy.

Ebb & Flo bookshop will be working alongside St Mary's supporting the 'birthday book' initiative and will have a copy of each class list in store. As the year progresses, we will cross off titles from the list and send this out to you again updated. We realise that this may present an unnecessary expense for some, or that some would simply rather not do this, so please be assured there is absolutely no obligation, and it is, of course, completely voluntary.

Each list of books has been created by the class teacher and Diane at Ebb & Flo. This list is age appropriate and will be a really useful resource for you to use to encourage reading for pleasure at home. The class list will have already or will be sent on each Class Dojo story, additionally all lists will be put on the school website too.

Little Church

What is Little Church?

"Little Church" is the "Liturgy of the Word for Children". Our Parish welcomes families and the full participation of young children in the celebration of the Mass. Since 1987, children at St Mary's have enjoyed their own Liturgy of the Word through 'Little Church' at the 10.00am Sunday Mass. There are two groups: 3-6 and 7-10 year olds.

We try to ensure that Children's Liturgy is an enjoyable experience for the children which helps develop their relationship with God. We discuss the Gospel of the day at a level the children can understand and enjoy. We enrich this with discussion, prayers, songs, and readings. We also try to

raise awareness of God's love, the humanity of Jesus, the Seasons of the Church, the understanding of symbols in the Mass and the context of the Bible.

The children gather in Church for the beginning of the Mass with their families and after a blessing from Father they go out to the activity rooms with the leaders and helpers.

We return to lead the offertory procession and join our families for the rest of Holy Mass
