As many of you will know, we have three teachers leaving us temporarily on maternity leave at the end of this term: Mrs Singleton (SENDCO), Mrs Nicklin (DHT) and Mrs Banwell.

They have both been into school this week to speak with the teachers about the classes being handed over to them. Mrs Cooper, who currently works for one day a week in Y4, will work full time in Y4 from September.

I will cover the SENDCO (special educational needs and disabilities co-ordinator) role in Mrs Singleton's absence but I will be supported over the year by a very experienced associate SENDCO, Mrs Taylor.

In the absence of Mrs Nicklin, our deputy headteacher, Miss Hesketh and Mr Cahalin are both stepping up to the role of acting assistant headteacher. They will carry out that role for half of the academic year each.

Sports News

Health Week

The children enjoyed a fantastic health week last week. Most classes were able to do their sports day events (Year 1 and 2 was postponed due to rain - but it is taking place next week). They experienced a wide range of activities and events including: foot darts, gymnastics in the hall with all the apparatus out, football tournaments led by our Y6 sports leaders and helpers, the colour run and many other things besides.

Quad Kids Events

Last week children from Ys 2, 4 and 6 took part in the Chorley Schools Sports Partnership (CSSP) Quad Kids event at Westway Sports Centre. This is a multi-discipline event: a sprint, a long run, a throw and a jump. There were some fine individual performances with many winners in running heats. Y2s came seventh out of fourteen teams, Y4s came fifth and Y6s finished in seventh.

A notable performance was that of George in Y6; he finished up as the overall champion boy in Chorley accumulating the most points over the four events. Congratulations to the three teams for their great performances and on their wonderful sporting behaviour. A big thanks, too, to Mr Hodge for taking them along.

Chorley Headteachers Football Cup

A few weeks ago, a local headteacher asked if any schools fancied a friendly football match because, due to the pandemic, their Y6s had not had chance to play many games over the last couple of years. That idea quickly snowballed into a mini-tournament. The CSSP, kindly agreed to organise it and they arranged for over twenty local schools to take part. It was great to see all these children have one last opportunity to represent their school and wear their school football shirts with pride.

On Tuesday evening last week, St Mary's played two group games, a semi-final and a final, winning them all. This meant they qualified for the grand final at St George's, last Friday evening. Here they met Balshaw Lane, the winners from the other half of the draw. In a great encounter, St Mary's emerged as winners. St Mary's now can call themselves League and Cup double winners! That's a first since I have been at St. Mary's. Congratulations to the team and to Mr Hodge.

Free School Meals – Are you missing out?

Free School Meal Eligibility and Pupil Premium Funding

Because all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a free school meal, many parents do not realise that they might be entitled to something called **free school meal eligibility**. And we understand why this might be the case because the system is confusing! At St Mary's, we have noticed a fall in the number of infant children whose parents have claimed eligibility since the introduction of free school meals for all infants –other schools have noticed the same.

This free school meal eligibility can be applied for in Reception, Year 1 and in Year 2 even though children are receiving a school meal anyway. And parents in Y3, 4, 5 and 6 can also apply.

Why bother applying if your child is receiving a free meal anyway?

If you think you might be eligible it is very much worth applying for two reasons:

1. Your child will continue to receive free school meals on leaving the infants in Y3, Y4, Y5 and Y6 and beyond
2. The school receives additional money (pupil premium) for children eligible for free school meals (over £1 300 per pupil).

If you receive any of the benefits below, St Mary's School can access this extra funding, called pupil premium.

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance

- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on – paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit

How can you find out if you are eligible? Apply by phone – and you can find out in a matter of minutes!

You can ring the local **Free School Meals and Pupil Premium team on 01772 531809**

It must be the person claiming the benefit that rings.

You will need to provide your:

- Name
- Date of birth
- National insurance number

They will confirm whether you are entitled over the telephone. **Apply by post**
