Mgr Canon Thomas Crank who was the Rector at St Mary's from 1897 – 1932 (35 years). In 1910 St Mary's Archway was opened by Canon Crank upon his Silver Jubilee of the Priesthood. Canon Crank had added the two side altars made in Caen stone, restructured the church, and made four new confessionals on the South wall. He also put in a new heating and ventilation system. He commissioned the statue of St Therese of Lisieux. Canon Crank retired in 1932 after many years of hard work and dedication to St Mary's. He died in 1946 and is buried in St Gregory's Church yard (if you are passing by with some nice flowers, lest we forget). Thank you.

ST JOHN HENRY CARDINAL NEWMAN,

9th October. Many people are praying earnestly that he will soon deservedly be proclaimed by the Holy Father a Doctor of the Church for all the rich teaching he gives us in his letters and writings. Meanwhile, a little reminder of his life given in the Breviary. Saint John Henry Newman was born on 21st February 1801 in London, England. As an Anglican clergyman for over twenty years, he won

renown as a preacher and theologian. A Fellow of Oriel College, Oxford, he became one of the leaders of the Oxford Movement and a prominent figure in the Church of England. On 9th October 1845 he was received into full communion with the Catholic Church by Blessed Dominic Barberi of the Passionist Congregation. After a period of study in Rome he was ordained priest on 30th May 1847. Returning to England he established the Oratory of Saint Philip Neri in Birmingham. He was an influential writer on many subjects, most notably the development of Christian doctrine, the true understanding of conscience, faith and reason, the role of the laity, and university education. In 1879 he was created Cardinal by Pope Leo XIII and given the titular church of of San Giorgio in Velabro. He died in the Birmingham Oratory on 11th August 1890. He was beatified by Pope Benedict XVI on 19th September 2010 and canonised by Pope Francis on 13th October 2019. Many of us will remember our parish trip to **Cofton Park, Longbridge, Birmingham for the beatification performed by His Holiness Pope Benedict XVI in his first state visit to the UK.**
