Dear Parents and Carers,

The number of positive cases has slowed to almost a complete stop in school; no children have been off with COVID over the last couple of days. So, thank you everyone for supporting our COVID measures. LCC Public Health called last week to say that the measures that we have put in place were having a significant impact in minimising the spread. Thank you for your support especially if we have advised children to take LFD tests.

STEM Week 14.02.22 – 18.02.22 (reminder - this information has already been shared separately by Mrs Banwell & Mr Cahalin)

This year we are celebrating STEM week (science, technology, engineering and maths) in school in order to promote and raise the profile of these subjects and to inspire our children to have a STEM career when they are older.

One of the aims of the week is to demonstrate to the children, through stimulating and interactive activities, how STEM subjects are integral in many areas of life. As part of this week, we will be holding a STEM Fair on Tuesday 15th February 2022. This is a great opportunity for the children to explore STEM subjects in fun and interesting ways.

We would like each child (on their own or in groups of up to four) to present an experiment or a research project of their choice, which they will prepare at home. Their projects can be presented in a variety of ways but they will need written information to go along with them to help others learn about their chosen topic. There are a lot of ideas online for different projects, *Pinterest* is a great place for inspiration. Children will then present their projects in their classroom. During Friday's award assembly certificates will be given for the best projects, we will be looking for originality, effort and a clear understanding of the subject being presented.






older children were treated to a Horrible Histories show about the Anglo Saxons.


St Mary's would like to say a big thank you to the Runshaw College Performing Arts Department and its students and would also like to add we would love to welcome you back any time!

Unavoidable School Closures

Over the course of this term, the hours of daylight will lengthen and I think we can sense that happening already. Hopefully, it will begin to warm up a little bit too. However, in the unlikely event of a very heavy snowfall and the need to close the school, we will inform you via the *GroupCall* text, announcements on the local radio and via the school website.

Free School Meals – Are you missing out?

Free School Meal Eligibility and Pupil Premium Funding

Because all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a free school meal, many parents do not realise that they might be entitled to something called **free school meal eligibility**. And we understand why this might be the case because the system is confusing! At St Mary's, we have noticed a fall in the number of infant children whose parents have claimed eligibility since the introduction of free school meals for all infants —other schools have noticed the same.

This free school meal eligibility can be applied for in Reception, Year 1 and in Year 2 even though children are receiving a school meal anyway. And parents in Y3, 4, 5 and 6 can also apply.

Why bother applying if your child is receiving a free meal anyway?

If you think you might be eligible it is very much worth applying for two reasons:

- 1. Your child will continue to receive free school meals on leaving the infants in Y3, Y4, Y5 and Y6 and beyond
- 2. The school receives additional money (pupil premium) for children eligible for free school meals (over £1 300 per pupil).

If you receive any of the benefits below, St Mary's School can access this extra funding, called pupil premium.

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit

How can you find out if you are eligible? Apply by phone – and you can find out in a matter of minutes!

You can ring the local **Free School Meals and Pupil Premium team on 01772 531809** It must be the person claiming the benefit that rings.

You will need to provide your:

- Name
- Date of birth
- National insurance number

They will confirm whether you are entitled over the telephone. Apply by post
