Christmas Performances

Well done to all the children in the Nursery and the infants for their wonderful Nativity performances over the last week.

The **Nursery** and **Reception** children were fantastic in their acting, singing and in remembering their lines for their Nativity performance of *A Miracle in Town.* It was a brilliant performance and made parents and school staff, alike, very proud. Well done!



Well done to **Year 1** and **Year 2** for their Nativity, **A Magical Christmas Journey**. The two classes combined extremely well to tell the story of the birth of Jesus two thousand years ago. They spoke clearly, sang beautifully, acted and danced very well in order to share with us, this special story.

As I said at the end of all the performances, these productions serve as one of the ways in which the children learn the story of the first coming of Christ and they help them prepare for Christmas Day which is now only just over a week away.

Thank you to all the staff and volunteers for their hard work in preparing the children so well and to the team of parents for their work on the fantastic set design this year. Thank you, parents, for supporting all our performances in great number and for contributing to our collections for Derian House, St Catherine's Hospice, Meningitis Now and towards meeting costs of licenses and costumes etc. at the end. The Nativity collections raised £550. Licenses and costumes cost approximately £120 so we will be able to donate on your behalf nearly £430 which is an amazing total.

Junior Carol Concert Monday 16th December at 6.00pm

The children in the juniors (Y3 to Y6) will be performing their Carol Concert and tableau in Church on the evening of **Monday 16**th **December** at <u>6.00pm</u>. Prior to that they will have one final practice at Church on Monday morning. Parents of

children in the juniors, **please could you drop your children from 8.45 at Church on Monday morning**. Many thanks.

On Monday evening, we would like all the children to meet in Church. We would like children in **Y4** to arrive no earlier than **5.45pm** as they will need to get changed in the sacristy. Children in Y3, Y5 and Y6 should arrive from no earlier than **5.50 pm** and no later than **5.55pm**.

Children must wear full uniform and look smart please - coats and other belongings to be left with parents, please.

The concert will start at 6.00pm and the performance will last between 40 minutes and an hour at the most. There will be a collection at the end to contribute to the Church's heating costs for the evening and for local charities such as Derian House and St Catherine's as well as *Meningitis Now*. It should be a lovely evening if previous years' events are anything to go by.

A couple of messages from Mrs Wilson and Mrs Hargreaves in the office:




- As we come to the end of a long autumn term Mrs Hargreaves and Mrs Wilson have asked if any overdue payments are settled as soon as possible. Thank you.

Year 1 recently received a book from Ebb & Flo bookshop that had a moving effect on the children (and staff!).

The book is called **'It's a No Money Day'** by Kate Milner - Mum works really hard, but today there is no money left and no food in the cupboards. Forced to visit the local foodbank, Mum feels ashamed that they have to rely on the kindness of others, but her young daughter can still see all the good in her day like reading and drawing, and even the foodbank. Maybe one day things will be different but for now together they brighten up even the darkest of days. A moving insight into the sad rise and necessity of foodbanks from the perspective of society's most vulnerable.

The children realised how lucky we all are and as such they all brought foodbank donations in and one of the parents - Mrs Houghton has very kindly wrapped the parcels up for them and for Year 2 who have also read the book and wanted to help, and these will be taken to the foodbank tomorrow.

Following on from this, we as a school wish to offer our support and Living Waters foodbank have

put out a plea as they are - DESPERATE for the following items:

Applying for School Places September 2020

PRIMARY

Nursery/ pre-school children – due to start Reception class in primary school in September 2020. The statutory closing date is 15 January 2020 – just over four weeks away.

VERY IMPORTANT: You must apply even if you already have siblings in school. If you live in Lancashire you can include out of area preferences on your online application.

Please remember that admissions to St Mary's, or any Catholic primary schools, also require the completion of the separate supplementary information form (SIF).

Break time snacks

Children (and staff) do get a bit peckish around about break time and we are happy for them to have a snack. Our policy is for this snack to be toast or a piece of fruit on Monday to Thursday and a snack of their choice on a Friday. The school provides toast which works out at 20p a day on a pre-ordered

basis. Alternatively, children may bring in a snack from home. We do ask that all pupils adhere to this rule. Chocolate bars, sweets and crisps are not allowed on Monday to Thursday.
