This is the week we return after the half term break in the summer term. For parents of children in Y5 we are looking at a potential change with an earlier than usual visit. We are looking at dates in autumn 2020 for their residential visit when they move into Y6.



Walking to and from school alone policy

It has been custom and practice in most primary schools up and down the country for many, many years for some of the older children in school to walk to and from school alone. We have done this ourselves at St Mary's. As part of our safeguarding procedures, I have put together a policy about this and am sending it out with this newsletter. This is because, as a school, we have a responsibility to hand children safely over to their parents (or other nominated collector) at the end of a school day, but obviously when they walk home on their own, we cannot do this.

That said, we realise that when the Y6s move up to high school into Y7, many of the children make their way to and from school by themselves. Therefore, Y6 parents like to give their children this independence in preparation and often in the last half term of the school year. Yesterday we sent out an electronic consent form to parents in Y6 to let them notify us if they wish their child to walk to and from school alone.

If parents notify us that their child is able to walk home alone, then we will release them at the end of the school day. If parents indicate that they do not want their child to walk home, we will keep them in school until collected.

In terms of effective management and organisation, it has to be an 'all or nothing' arrangement. By that, I mean that we are unable to monitor if a child only walks home on certain days of the week or for example on a Friday in two weeks' time. This would be impossible to manage. So, to clarify, if a parent allows their child to walk to and from school alone, we will let them go alone at the end of each and every school day. If a parent does not allow their child to go home alone, we will hang on to them each and every day until collected. I have amended the policy (3.19) to show this.

Start of school year Mass at St Mary's

Children from Years 3, 5 and 6 attended Mass on Wednesday morning to celebrate the start of the new school year. Children from Y5 read the Bidding Prayers beautifully and clearly as did Evie in Y6 with the Responsorial Psalm. The rest of the children joined in well in singing the hymns and behaved very well throughout. Fr Marsden spoke to the children in his homily about making a good start to their school year and Martin Fyles, trainee priest, introduced himself to the children and set them a challenge for when he comes into school with Fr Marsden next Monday afternoon.

Y4 Sacramental Programme - Sacramental Cheese & Wine Evening

This year's Sacramental Programme began with a Cheese and Wine Evening at school for parents last Tuesday. Fr Marsden and Mrs Gray-Grzeczynska, introduced the programme and explained the process of *Family Catechesis*.



The programme has run very successfully since it started a number of years ago. Father Marsden reminded us of the importance and strength of the partnership we have between home, school and parish at St Mary's. Mrs O'Neil and Miss Wilson have joined the family Catechesis team and will be supporting the children in their Sacramental journey this year. Thank you parents for a great turnout.

Nursery Pupils/Primary School Admissions: If your child is in their last year of pre-school/nursery you can now apply for their primary school place at: www.lancashire.gov.uk/schools It's quick and easy to do and you will receive email confirmation of your application.

VERY IMPORTANT: You must apply even if you already have siblings in school. If you live in Lancashire you can include out of area preferences on your online application.

The closing date for primary applications for September 2020 is 23:59 on 15 January 2020.

Please remember that admissions to St Mary's, or any Catholic primary schools, also require the completion of the separate supplementary information form (SIF).

Year 6 Pupils

Secondary school admissions: If your child is in Year 6 you can now apply for their secondary school place at www.lancashire.gov.uk/schools

It's quick and easy to do and you will receive email confirmation of your application.

VERY IMPORTANT: You must apply even if you already have siblings in school. If you live in Lancashire you can include out of area preferences on your online application.

The closing date for secondary applications for September 2020 is 23:59 on 31 October 2019

Break time snacks

Children (and staff) do get a bit peckish around about break time and we are happy for them to have a snack. Our policy is for this snack to be toast or a piece of fruit on Monday to Thursday and a snack of their choice on a Friday. The school provides toast which works out at 20p a day on a pre-ordered basis. Alternatively, children may bring in a snack from home. We do ask that all pupils adhere to this rule. Chocolate bars, sweets and crisps are not allowed on Monday to Thursday.

Little Church




Some beginning of school year and nursery year reminders

Labelling Uniforms

Nut allergies



We have a number of children in school who have an allergy to nuts and may experience a severe allergic reaction. We therefore make every effort to be as **nut-free** as possible in school. Therefore, we ask that you do not to send food products into school which may contain nuts. Thank you for your understanding.

Grapes in lunch boxes

If your child brings grapes to school either as a snack or as part of their packed lunch, it is very important that they are halved first. This is because whole grapes present a significant risk of choking hazard to children.



Parking



By way of a reminder at the start of the school year, I would appreciate your cooperation in parking safely and considerately at drop-off and pick-up times. Please do not park on the staff carpark, the yellow zig zag lines outside the gates and please do not park across resident's driveways. Thank you.

School entrance

At the start and end of the school day there are two entrances to the school in use: Walgarth Drive and Warton Place. The Warton place entrance can also be accessed from Hornchurch Drive via the alleyway that runs parallel to the staff car park. <u>Please do not use the path in the staff car park entrance.</u> This may only be used during the school day when the other entrances are locked.
