# **Chorley Library Summer Reading Challenge - Reading Heroes**

This summer, we are challenging children across Lancashire to become a Reading Hero and help Dr Paige Turner to stop the evil super villain "The Spoiler"!

Reading Heroes is the brand-new summer reading programme offered in all libraries across Lancashire, which encourages children aged 4 to 12 (although not exclusively) to keep reading through the summer holidays, offering prizes for those who manage to read 5 books over the summer, and additional incentives for those who manage to also complete a number of challenges.

# How it works

Sign up at your local library and receive a booklet containing all the information you need to help defeat The Spoiler, including a comic book story which can be unlocked along the way.

To become a Reading Hero, you will need to **read five books** over the course of the summer, collecting stickers and prizes along the way!

To become a Reading Superhero, you will need to read five books and complete 3 of the suggested tasks in the booklet. Doing this will enter you into a prize draw for a special prize!

We'll be running some fantastic events to help you defeat The Spoiler in our libraries.

# Chorley Superheroes Hunt - 19th August - 10th September Astley Park Walled Garden

We received an email asking us to publicise a Chorley Superheroes Hunt event ...

Hi,

My name is Rachael Harty and along with my husband we run the charity association Rory's Box, based in Chorley.

I am a mum of 2 young boys, Noah who is 5 and Rory who was 2. Rory, my youngest son died following a leukaemia diagnosis in December 21, just 12 weeks after diagnosis.

I was hoping you would be able to let your teachers, staff and importantly the parents of the school know about a childhood cancer awareness event that we are running in Astley Park over the summer holidays.

Chorley's Superheroes Event is a free event, in the walled gardens at Astley Park. The superheroes the children have to find are all Chorley children who have had a cancer diagnosis. For the adults, along the way there is vital and lifesaving information about the common signs and symptoms of all Childhood Cancer. Our opening day is the 19<sup>th</sup> August where there will be glitter tattoos available for the children and it will run until the 10<sup>th</sup> September. September being childhood cancer awareness month.

As teachers and school/nursery staff, you see our children just as much as we do, so for ALL adults to be aware of the symptoms of childhood cancer includes teachers/school/nursery staff immensely.

The aim of the event is to bring more awareness of the symptoms of childhood cancer, which will then bring earlier diagnosis, saving many of our children's lives. Childhood cancer is the biggest killer of our children, but the education and knowledge surrounding it is very little compared to other childhood illnesses.

Our event is supported and endorsed by Regent House Surgery in Chorley, and Chorley Borough council.

We would be very grateful if you are able to communicate this to your Childrens parents, via any online apps you use and newsletters. Also, if you can make all the teachers and staff aware.


I completely understand that the open communication about Childhood Cancer is taboo, and not widely spoken about. It's sad, its heartbreaking and unthinkable. However, whilst society doesn't talk about it, children will continue to get late diagnosis of childhood cancer, children will continue to die from Childhood Cancer. 1 in 450 children in the UK will receive a diagnosis by the age of 15. When you think of the attendance of schools, and the number of children per school, it suddenly doesn't seem as rare as we are made to believe.

We are hoping along with the GP surgeries and council, that this event will give adults the knowledge to be able to advocate for their child in a medical setting. It will give teachers the confidence to mention something to a parent that doesn't seem quite right, it may be nothing, but with the correct knowledge behind you, teachers can feel confident in giving the advice that a child needs to be checked out.
