Dear parents/ carers,

We have been in school for eight weeks since the return after the January/ February lockdown - five weeks since the start of the summer term and three weeks before. Many parents, quite understandably, will be worried that their child(ren) may have fallen behind due to not being in school in January/ February and also due to the lengthy closure in 2020.

I would just like to reassure you that the children (and staff) are working incredibly hard – one Governor remarked, *'it's a hive of industry –every nook and cranny of the school is being used for learning.*' The children's attitude to their schoolwork is excellent, whether in regular lessons or in catch-up sessions – all the staff are telling me this. Although it is way too early to assess the impact fully, I can tell you that pupils across school are getting the support they need to catch up to where they need to be and then to keep up.

Mental Health Awareness week - 10 May - 14 May

This week was a national Mental Health Awareness week. In assembly on Wednesday, we defined what we mean by the term 'mental health,' that we all have it (like our physical health) and how important it is to look after it. We discussed the fact that it is really all about our thoughts and feelings. Sometimes these thoughts and feelings are small or sometimes they can become quite big and too much for us. We told the children about the need to talk to someone if this is ever the case. Please the *You're never too young to talk about mental health* resource attached for you to explore some of these issues at home, if you so wish.

COVID Lateral Flow Device tests

A reminder that **anyone in Lancashire** is eligible to access **free**, rapid coronavirus tests for themselves and their families to use twice a week.

These can be obtained locally from Woodlands Conference Centre (opposite Parklands School), from the Tesco Extra supermarket on Foxhole Road, Lloyds Pharmacy on Devonshire Road and from The Hub pharmacy on Peel Street.

Another plea from the EYFS (Nursery and Reception classes)!

The EYFS team have asked me to pass on the following message. Please note that children must not play on play equipment at the start or end of the school day e.g. the wooden house in the infant playground or the trim trail in the junior playground.

Similarly, children are not allowed in the Early Years play area (next to the Nursery class). The staff work hard to tidy the area and make it ready for the next day. I have reminded children about botht these things in assembly today. Many thanks for your cooperation.

SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION

Dear parent/guardian, the Archdiocese of Liverpool is inviting young people in year 8 (and above) to the Sacrament of Confirmation. Confirmation is the sacrament through which we receive the Holy Spirit to make us stronger and more perfect Christians and true witnesses of Jesus Christ.

The preparation for the sacrament will be started through a series of video introductions to the sacrament from Animate, the archdiocesan youth ministry team (if your child has not seen these in school please direct them to https://www.youtube.com/user/AnimateYouth and find the four 'Called ... videos.

Year 8 pupils will then study the subject of confirmation in their RE classes. There will also be preparation sessions at a local level in your town/local area. Following these local preparation times young people will be invited to be confirmed. If your child would like to receive the sacrament of

confirmation this year it is essential they register online at: https://liverpoolcalled.co.uk/ Registration must take place before 28thJune.

Please complete the form that can be accessed through clicking the button at the top right-hand side of the webpage ('Register for Confirmation'). If you are unable to do this at home, please inform the school chaplain who will be able to help.

Free School Meals – Are you missing out?

Free School Meal Eligibility and Pupil Premium Funding

Because all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a free school meal, many parents do not realise that they might be entitled to something called **free school meal eligibility**. And we understand why this might be the case because the system is confusing! At St Mary's, we have noticed a fall in the number of infant children whose parents have claimed eligibility since the introduction of free school meals for all infants –other schools have noticed the same.

This free school meal eligibility can be applied for in Reception, Year 1 and in Year 2 even though children are receiving a school meal anyway. And parents in Y3, 4, 5 and 6 can also apply.

Why bother applying if your child is receiving a free meal anyway?

If you think you might be eligible it is very much worth applying for two reasons:

1. Your child <u>will continue to receive free school meals on leaving the infants in Y3, Y4, Y5 and Y6</u> and beyond

2. The school receives additional money (pupil premium) for children eligible for free school meals (over £1 300 per pupil).

If you receive any of the benefits below, St Mary's School can access this extra funding, called pupil premium.

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit

How can you find out if you are eligible?

Apply by phone – and you can find out in a matter of minutes!

You can ring the local Free School Meals and Pupil Premium team on 01772 531809

It must be the person claiming the benefit that rings.

You will need to provide your:

- Name
- Date of birth
- National insurance number

They will confirm whether you are entitled over the telephone.
