Caretaker/ Site Supervisor Vacancy

2024 SCHOOL ADMISSIONS PROCEDURES – PRIMARY AND SECONDARY

St Mary's Prospective Parents Open Day/ Open Evening

There will be an open evening event on <u>Tuesday 3rd October</u> [not Tuesday 6 October as I wrote last week!] at 6pm for parents interested in a place for their child in our reception class for September 2024. More details will follow.

Primary School Admissions September 2024: If your child is in their last year of pre-school/nursery you can now apply for their primary school place at: <u>https://www.lancashire.gov.uk/children-education-families/schools/apply-for-a-school-place/starting-primary-school/</u> for a September 2024 start.

It is quick and easy to do and you will receive email confirmation of your application. **VERY IMPORTANT: You must apply even if you already have siblings in a school**. If you live in Lancashire you can include out of area preferences on your online application.

School places are not allocated on a first come, first served basis. All applications received up to the closing date are given equal priority, but if you miss the deadline, a late application may reduce your chance of getting your preference of school. The national closing date for primary applications is **15 January 2024**. Between now and 15th January all applications are processed and all preferences are considered against the school's published admissions policy for school year 2024 – 2025 https://www.chorleystmarys.lancs.sch.uk/our-school/admissions

**Please remember that admissions to St Mary's, or any Catholic primary schools, also require the completion of the separate supplementary information form (SIF) - available at https://www.chorleystmarys.lancs.sch.uk/our-school/admissions **

Year 6 Pupils moving to Year 7

Secondary school admissions: If your child is in Year 6 you can now apply for their secondary school place at <u>https://www.lancashire.gov.uk/children-education-families/schools/apply-for-a-school-place/starting-secondary-school/</u> for a start in Year 7, in September 2024.

It's quick and easy to do and you will receive email confirmation of your application. **VERY IMPORTANT: You must apply even if you already have siblings in school.** If you live in Lancashire you can include out of area preferences on your online application.

The arrangements for the transfer of pupils to secondary schools in September 2024 will, as far as possible, conform to the following timetable.

1 September 2023 - Apply from this date

School places are not allocated on a first come, first served basis. All applications received up to the closing date are given equal priority, but if you miss the deadline, a late application may reduce your chance of getting your preference of school.

31 October 2023 - National closing date for secondary applications (statutory).

'Liturgy of the Word for Children'

What is Little Church?

"Little Church" is the "Liturgy of the Word for Children". Our Parish welcomes families and the full participation of young children in the celebration of the Mass. Since 1987, children at St Mary's have enjoyed their own Liturgy of the Word through 'Little Church' at the 10.30am Sunday Mass. There are two groups; 3-6 and 7-10 year olds.

We try to ensure that Children's Liturgy is an enjoyable experience for the children which helps develop their relationship with God. We discuss the Gospel of the day at a level the children can understand and enjoy. We enrich this with discussion, prayers, songs and readings. We also try to raise awareness of God's love, the humanity of Jesus, the Seasons of the Church, the understanding of symbols in the Mass and the context of the Bible.

The children gather in Church for the beginning of the Mass with their families and after a blessing from Father they go out to the activity rooms with the leaders and helpers. We return to lead the offertory procession and join our families for the rest of Holy Mass.

What do the children think about Little Church?



Is there a crèche?

There is a crèche/play area at the back of the church for families with babies and toddlers to use. Parents / carers remain with their babies / toddlers in the crèche area as this facility is not supervised.

Can I accompany my child?

Parents/carers are welcome to accompany their child until they are confident to attend alone. However, if a parent/carer attends on a regular basis (more than 3 or 4 times) they will be expected to complete a DBS check. This is in accordance with the advice and guidance given by the Archdiocese of Liverpool.

What do parents/carers think about Little Church?

My children love going to Little Church and are excited to attend

When my children are in Little Church, it gives me an opportunity to listen and take part in the Mass knowing they are safe and happy.

My baby sometimes cries so the crèche at the back of church is great. I can pop out when I need to settle

We talk about 'Little Church' as a family at home. It is a good way for us to discuss God.

My son always comes back with a beaming smile

Can I get involved?

We are always keen to welcome new leaders and helpers. There is no previous experience needed and full guidance and support will be given. We meet two or three times a year to plan activities etc. Currently we ask for a commitment to lead or assist approximate once every 6 weeks. We would appreciate any help that is offered.

What about safeguarding and DBS checks?

St Mary's Parish is committed to the protection of children and vulnerable adults and complies fully with the guidance give by the Archdiocese of Liverpool. This means that all volunteers who come into contact with children and/or vulnerable adults must comply with the safeguarding procedures. A team of trained volunteers co-ordinates the administration of these procedures on behalf of the Parish.
