#### General Election 12<sup>th</sup> December 2020 - Unavoidable School Closure

It has been confirmed by Chorley Borough Council that there will be polling in Chorley as there are three candidates standing for election. Therefore, the school and nursery will be **closed** to children on **Thursday 12**<sup>th</sup> **December** as it will be being used as a polling station.

### RE monitoring Visit – Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> November

In September 2016, we received an RE inspection which found the school to be outstanding in RE, Catholic Life and Collective Worship. Our next RE inspection will be in in the school year 2021/2022.

We received an interim visit on Tuesday by one of the education officers from the Archdiocese of Liverpool Education Department. She told us that the school was maintaining its high standards in all areas and she gave us some pointers to what we could do even better. In an email to me on Tuesday evening she ended with: *Well done – you* [St Mary's] *have a lovely, happy school.* 

#### **New Chair of Governors**

Mrs Rogerson has stepped down from the role of Chair of the Governing Board of St Mary's and has taken up the position of Vice- Chair. Mrs Smith was appointed Chair in her place. Mrs Rogerson has been the Chair since September 1994; that represents an incredible 25 years of service to the children and families of this school and nursery. On behalf of everybody associated with St Mary's past and present, we say a big thank you to her for her time, dedication and commitment in her role. We do so in the knowledge we will not be losing her expertise as she stays on the board.

Congratulations to Mrs Smith, who has also given many years of service to the school, and we thank her for stepping up to this very important and responsible role.

#### Parents Evening Y3 and Y4

The Y3 and Y4 parents evening will take place on **Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> November** after school. The online booking system is live but closes at midday, Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> November. If you have difficulty accessing, please contact the school office.

As with the parents' evening earlier on in the term, the meetings are of five minutes duration and you can also come along and look at the work in the children's books. In the past, parents have told us that they didn't need such an early in the year parents' evening and that they are happy the way their children have settled into their new class. That is why we reduced it to five minutes per meeting. So, we don't want you to feel obliged to attend but we don't want to put you off either!

There will be a longer, more in-depth parents' evening in the spring term lasting 10 minutes, where the teachers will be able to talk in more detail about your child's progress.

#### **Anti- Bullying Week**

Next week we will be spending some time looking at the problem of bullying and what we can do to keep ourselves and other safe from it.

#### **Parent Questionnaire**

Mrs Wilson sent out a questionnaire to parents via *GroupCall* a couple of weeks ago. Please take time to have a look at and complete if you haven't done so already. It helps us as we continually try to improve what we do in giving the children the best education possible. There have been over 160 responses so far, so thank you very much. The survey will close on Monday. We'll be giving the children the chance to have their say over the next couple of weeks too.

#### **Judaism Week**

The children have been learning about Judaism this week in school. Today we welcomed a visitor from the Pendle Faith Centre, Amy Troner, who spoke with children first in assembly and then in their classes about the Jewish faith.

#### **PRIMARY**

Nursery/ pre-school children – due to start Reception class in primary school in September 2020. The statutory **closing date is 15 January 2020.**

#### **Break time snacks**

Children (and staff) do get a bit peckish around about break time and we are happy for them to have a snack. Our policy is for this snack to be toast or a piece of fruit on Monday to Thursday and a snack of their choice on a Friday. The school provides toast which works out at 20p a day on a pre-ordered basis. Alternatively, children may bring in a snack from home. We do ask that all pupils adhere to this rule. Chocolate bars, sweets and crisps are not allowed on Monday to Thursday.
