Eco Schools Green Flag

Hopefully, by now you will have seen our new Eco-Schools Green Flag fluttering on its flagpole.

Mr Cahalin organised a special flag-raising ceremony for us on Tuesday

morning. The children gathered waving their amazing homemade Eco flags. The Eco-Council read us a very thought-provoking poem. Mrs Nicklin, who leads the Eco Council with Mr Cahalin, brought her very well-behaved daughter, Elizabeth to watch proceedings, and gave us a few words. Cllr Stephen Holgate gave a short speech before Sea Cadet Leon in Y6 hoisted the flag to its prominent position. We finished with a beautiful Eco song the children have been learning in class. Sir Lindsay Hoyle was unable to attend but he sent us a special video message.

The flag ...

- is a way to acknowledge, reward and celebrate the ecological achievements of our children and that their hard work is appreciated
- it provides them with the confidence and motivation needed to continue actively engaging with environmental issues throughout their lifetimes
- tells our local community that St Mary's is a forward-thinking school and promotes child-led environmental education and action.

Attendance 2022/ 2023

The governors met this week and one of the topics for discussion was the school's attendance policy. The school has set itself a target of **97%** attendance and, at the moment, we are at about **96.4%**. Hopefully, in the summer term, with fewer germs spreading around we can get to or even surpass that 97% mark.

A reminder also that, as headteacher, I am unable to authorise leave of absence for holidays in term time. I am only able to authorise requests for leave of absence in term time if there are exceptional circumstances; and these are assessed on a case-by-case basis. If holidays are taken in term time, and the absence is five days or more, the school policy requires that the school will ask the local authority to issue a penalty charge notice. The penalty charge works out at approximately £60 per parent per child per week of absence.

On a more positive note, we want to reintroduce an end of year award for pupils whose attendance across the year has been very good to excellent. Keep an eye out for more details later in the year.

Y2 and Y6 Assessments (SATs) Meetings Monday 27th March

There will be meeting for parents of children in Year 2 who will be undertaking the end of KS1 assessments this summer and for the parents of children in Y6 who will be doing the national curriculum tests (SATs) in May. The Year 2 meeting will take place between 5.30pm – 6.00pm and the Y6 meeting will take place between 6.00 -6.30pm in order to accommodate parents who may have children in both classes. The Year 6 meeting will also give Mr Cahalin a chance to share some information about the upcoming Hothersall Lodge residential visit.
