Dear parents and carers,

We are halfway through the second half of the spring term. It feels like the weather is starting to warm up a bit, which will be great for break times and outdoor PE.

This week the infants ate together as a group in the hall for the first time in their time at school – I think - and that worked very well. We did all our assemblies in the hall this week including our first awards assembly there for exactly two years. Next week the KS2 children will eat in the hall rather than in their classrooms and they will all go out into the playground together.

Of course, we are keeping our eyes on the rapidly rising COVID rates and we may need to revert back to taking measures to minimise the spread once again.

Please could I ask if children have COVID symptoms that you arrange for PCR tests for them to help us identify positive cases and minimise spread in school. We have a couple of children who have tested positive and are self-isolating in this current wave.

Message from the school office regarding nuts and nut allergies

We have a number of children in school who have an allergy to nuts and may experience a severe allergic reaction. As a result, we make every effort to be as nut- free as possible in school and we ask that you do not send food products into school which may contain nuts.

There were at least two items today during lunchtime, which both contained hazelnuts. Please can we ask you to double-check any items you pack into your child's lunch box or their Friday treat. Thank you for your understanding.

Appeal from the Archdiocese of Liverpool

Last week, we mentioned the appeal from the Archdiocese of Liverpool, thank you to all those who were able to help. In the parish newsletter this week, it says,

'Please note that the collections for the Ukraine Appeal have now stopped at the Parish Centre. A van from Liverpool took all the donations on Thursday afternoon. Thank you to everyone for your generosity. It is much appreciated. Other medical items etc. can be handed in via the International

Aid Trust. Not clothes at the moment, because they have plenty in store – the problem is that of logistics – getting things transported out to the refuges and into Ukraine.'

Unavoidable School Closures

Over the course of this term, the hours of daylight will lengthen and I think we can sense that happening already. Hopefully, it will begin to warm up a little bit too. However, in the unlikely event of a very heavy snowfall and the need to close the school, we will inform you via the *GroupCall* text, announcements on the local radio and via the school website.

Free School Meals – Are you missing out?

Free School Meal Eligibility and Pupil Premium Funding

Because all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a free school meal, many parents do not realise that they might be entitled to something called **free school meal eligibility**. And we understand why this might be the case because the system is confusing! At St Mary's, we have

noticed a fall in the number of infant children whose parents have claimed eligibility since the introduction of free school meals for all infants –other schools have noticed the same.

This free school meal eligibility can be applied for in Reception, Year 1 and in Year 2 even though children are receiving a school meal anyway. And parents in Y3, 4, 5 and 6 can also apply.

Why bother applying if your child is receiving a free meal anyway?

If you think you might be eligible it is very much worth applying for two reasons:

- 1. Your child will continue to receive free school meals on leaving the infants in Y3, Y4, Y5 and Y6 and beyond
- 2. The school receives additional money (pupil premium) for children eligible for free school meals (over £1 300 per pupil).

If you receive any of the benefits below, St Mary's School can access this extra funding, called pupil premium.

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit

How can you find out if you are eligible? Apply by phone – and you can find out in a matter of minutes!

You can ring the local **Free School Meals and Pupil Premium team on 01772 531809** It must be the person claiming the benefit that rings.

You will need to provide your:

- Name
- Date of birth
- National insurance number

They will confirm whether you are entitled over the telephone. Apply by post
