COVID UPDATES

1.Y4 Bubble closure

Unfortunately, but probably inevitably, one of our class bubbles, Y4, had to close this week due to a positive COVID case in the class. The children have moved immediately to remote learning. All being well, they will all return to school on Monday 28 June. Thank you to the Y4 team: Mrs Banwell, Mrs Howarth, Mrs Root, Mrs Owsianska and Mrs Holt for getting the remote learning up and ready so quickly. Thank you to the Y4 parents for your support and cooperation too.

I thought it would be worth sharing the following with you if, in the unfortunate event, we have further positive cases in school. In summary, we would give you this information:

- I. That the bubble of children are asked to self-isolate for a period of 10 days. (Household members are not asked to self-isolate unless asked to do so separately).
- II. Advice on what to do if your child develops COVID symptoms during period of self-isolation.
- III. To request that you arrange for <u>PCR tests</u> (not lateral flow) for <u>your child and all household</u> members.

2. What to do if a member of your household tests positive for COVID over a weekend?

We would be very grateful if you could inform school if, in the unfortunate event, your child tests positive for COVID during any of the next few weekends, so that we can make arrangements for the rest of the class who would then need to self-isolate on the Monday. If another member of your household tests positive over any weekend so that your child needs to self-isolate on a Monday, please let school know on the Monday.

World Oceans Day

We considered the importance of the World's oceans in assembly on Wednesday this week. We looked at the enormous amount and the enormous variety of living things that dwell in them. We also considered the negative impact of humans on the oceans in recent decades and what we can do

to reduce the harm that is being caused. I have attached a leaflet which gives 25 tips on how to be a water hero; I told the children I would attach it to the newsletter this week.

PE kits

Thank you for your support in this. Most children wore the correct PE kits last week; please can you note the paragraph below.

Now we are in the summer months and enjoying much warmer weather, I would like the children to return to wearing their normal PE kit to school i.e. white t-shirt and black or blue shorts. They can also wear trainers, as their PE will be taking place outdoors unless of course it is raining. If it is a cooler day they can wear their school jumper or cardigan on top rather than wearing hoodies or tracksuits.

COVID Lateral Flow Device tests

A reminder that anyone in Lancashire is eligible to access free, rapid coronavirus tests for themselves and their families to use twice a week and we are beign urged to use them particularly during this period of rising cases.

These can be obtained locally from **Woodlands Conference Centre** (opposite Parklands School), from the **Tesco Extra supermarket** on Foxhole Road, **Lloyds Pharmacy** on Devonshire Road and from The Hub pharmacy on Peel Street.

First Holy Communion

Congratulations to our Sacramental class in Y4. They have now all received First Holy Communion. On Tuesday, Mrs Grzeczynska and Mrs O'Neill came into the school grounds (outside) and presented each of the children with a beautiful cross and an ornate certificate with which to commemorate this most special occasion. Music lessons

Please find attached information for parents/ carers to sign up for Lancashire Music Service - Parental Direct Payment Scheme (PDP) tuition. This is the programme for music tuition in school delivered by peripatetic teachers from the Lancashire Music Service. We currently have a number of children who access lessons on a range of instruments: flute, keyboard and guitars.

Children currently on the PDP scheme do not need to sign up again as they will receive information to re-register for September 2021 through the LMS 'Speedadmin' communications channel.

The cost of the tuition is

- Group (max 4 students) £7.50 p/lesson
- 20 minute individual £12.00 p/lesson
- 30 minute individual £14.00 p/lesson



Free School Meals - Are you missing out?

Free School Meal Eligibility and Pupil Premium Funding

Because all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a free school meal, many parents do not realise that they might be entitled to something called **free school meal eligibility**. And we understand why this might be the case because the system is confusing! At St Mary's, we have noticed a fall in the number of infant children whose parents have claimed eligibility since the introduction of free school meals for all infants —other schools have noticed the same.

This free school meal eligibility can be applied for in Reception, Year 1 and in Year 2 even though children are receiving a school meal anyway. And parents in Y3, 4, 5 and 6 can also apply.

Why bother applying if your child is receiving a free meal anyway?

If you think you might be eligible it is very much worth applying for two reasons:

- 1. Your child will continue to receive free school meals on leaving the infants in Y3, Y4, Y5 and Y6 and beyond
- 2. The school receives additional money (pupil premium) for children eligible for free school meals (over £1 300 per pupil).

If you receive any of the benefits below, St Mary's School can access this extra funding, called pupil premium.

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit

How can you find out if you are eligible?

Apply by phone – and you can find out in a matter of minutes!

You can ring the local **Free School Meals and Pupil Premium team on 01772 531809** It must be the person claiming the benefit that rings.

You will need to provide your:

Name

- Date of birth
- National insurance number

They will confirm whether you are entitled over the telephone.
