If you would like to take part in the School Development Fund Draw for 2025/2026, please watch out for the Groupcall form which will be sent to you at the end of term. This explains how the draw works, how much it costs to join per month/year and how you can pay. It will give you the bank details to set up a standing order mandate to start in September, or you can send cash to school when we return in September.

Why we do it

As a Catholic Voluntary Aided School we are required to make a 10% contribution towards funding the major repairs to our school building. This amount is collected by means of a levy paid to the Archdiocese Schools Building Fund. Currently the cost of this is approximately £1,560 per year.

St Mary's school levy has always been a voluntary contribution from parents in in the form of the School Development Draw - a monthly lottery.

There are approximately 160 families at St Mary's. A voluntary contribution from families of £1.00 a month (£12.00 per year) would help cover the cost of the levy and the lottery prize fund. All contributors participate in the monthly draw and we award prizes of £10 per month, with a special draw in July for a prize of £25. Contributors can be from parents, carers, aunties, uncles, grandparents - all we ask is that they are over 18 years of age.

PAYMENT

Paying into the fund is easy; most conveniently by a Standing Order set up with your bank from **September** for either £1.00 per month or £12.00 per year. All you need to do is give your bank the details of who and where to pay and we can provide that on request.

Alternatively, we can accept an annual payment of £12.00 by cash; please **send to the office in September (not your child's classroom!)** in a sealed envelope marked with your child's name and "School Development Fund" on the front. This payment method will mean you have one entry for one academic year and **this amount should be paid each September so that your membership doesn't lapse.**

Once payment is received, we will allocate you with a number and this will remain yours until you decide to cancel your membership permanently. However, we do have many parents who are still members long after their children have left St Mary's!

UNDECIDED?

You may decide not to enter the draw this time, but you can join at any time in the future (just contact the school office) and we will also send out invitations each September. THANK YOU!

Tax-free childcare

One of our governors shared some information with me last year to pass on to parents and carers - here is a reminder, in case your circumstances have changed.:

You can get up to £500 every 3 months (up to £2,000 a year) for each of your children to help with the costs of childcare. This goes up to £1,000 every 3 months if a child is disabled (up to £4,000 a year). For every £8 you pay into this account, the government will pay in £2 to use to pay your provider.

You can get Tax-Free Childcare at the same time as 30 hours free childcare if you're eligible for both. You can use Tax-Free Childcare for: childminders, nurseries and nannies and after school clubs and play schemes.https://www.gov.uk/tax-free-childcare


Chorley Marlins
